## 7:15pm: Community Crime and Safety Report from Officer Tham Phan

- Officer Phan answered a question regarding the increased number of crimes; this correlates with summer break

- Prinicipal Folk, who is an AG and MPHS graduate, has worked at various schools throughout the district
- AG has 1400 students, a result of the rezoning that affected AG
- The school has a highly involved parent base, neighbors in the AG zone are encouraged to become involved as well. There are opportunities to run afterschool programs

## 8:09pm: Presidents Report
