7:05pm: Meeting began with introduction and general announcements from president

7:15pm: Community Crime and Safety Report from Officer Tam Phan

- Dennis Whittington from Code Enforcement introduced the new Community Resource Officer, Officer Phan
- Intro from Officer Phan, including a background on his career at the Westover Division and a description on the process of selecting a replacement for Officer Mohammed
- Officer Phan provided a report detailing crime in the neighborhood from March 1st to April 7th. No major crimes were reported, though some minor thefts and property crimes were reported. Neighbors are reminded to keep house and car doors locked.
- Property and violent crime are down 40% in the Westover Division. In one 7 day period, there were 616 calls for service, division wide. In our neighborhood there only 89
- Concerns about suspicious activity were raised; neighbors were urged to call CMPD with any concerns

- Description of construction on the new Collinswood Language Academy
- Turner Construction has worked on several projects for CMS

- Great Outdoors University was created in 2012 and is a program of the North Carolina Wildlife Foundation
- The program is designed to connect children of all ages with nature
- 1/3 of NC children are obese, ADD and ADHD are extremely prevalent, and children spend just a few minutes each day in unstructured, screen-free play outside
- The program does not charge for its activities, and works in partnership with organizations such as the Boys and Girls Club
- Activities include hikes, workshops, ropes courses, day trips, and other events
- Great Outdoors University seeks to help address misconceptions young people may have about nature
- Other events include family fun days, the next of which will be on April 27th in Matthews. 300-600 people are expected to attend
- Volunteers are always appreciated and a part time program manager is needed

- A review of the work the Commissioner has been engaged in since being elected
- A discussion of taxes and property revaluations was presented
 - Average increase in property values of 43% city-wide
 - Increases in Madison Park are based on recent in the neighborhood which have been trending upward
 - An informal review process is ongoing reviews can be requested through May 26th
 - Tax relief program are available in certain situtations for those who are eligible
- On May 2nd, the County Manager will release budget recommendations. Commissioner Harden believes there will be a revenue neutral rate. The Manager will recommend a rate, and a public hearing will be held on May 9th to discuss the matter
- The City of Charlotte will undertake a similar procedure for budgetary purposes
- On April 26th, there will be a Senior Citizen Town Hall at Marion Diehl from 11:30am -12:30pm
- On May 16th, three listening sessions will take place at various locations:
 - o 10:00am 11:30am
 - 3:00pm 4:30pm
 - o 6:00pm 7:30pm
- A vote on the budget will take place May 26th to May 29th
