#### What Is Y-FRIENDz?

A mentoring program with YMCA Youth & Family Services that matches mentors with youth, ages 4-15, who have one or both parents incarcerated.

#### What Do Y-FRIENDz (Mentors) Do?

Y-FRIENDz mentors provide young people with a positive role model. Mentors have a unique opportunity to participate in a variety of exciting and rewarding activities. Fun activities can include sports, cultural events, art projects, games and tutoring.

## Common Concerns: "I don't think I have enough time."

Mentoring simply means involving an at risk youth in everyday activities. Having lunch or hanging out once a week will significantly improve that child's life.

#### "Why mentor children of incarcerated parents?"

Statistics show that children of incarcerated parents are at greater risk for substance abuse and involvement in the criminal justice system. However, having a supportive positive role model will give these young people an opportunity to become successful.

#### "What if I get into a situation I can't handle?"

There is a vast support system in place. Y-FRIENDz works closely with school counselors and other social service agencies and also has professional staff who are always available to help.

#### "What if I can't afford it?"

You do not necessarily have to spend money. There are a lot of ways to mentor, many of which are available at no cost. Hiking, playing ball, helping out with school or going to a museum are just a few ideas of fun activities that won't cost you a dime.
