# Historic Guidelines Being Revised

Landmarks Commission Reviewed

INA President, Beverly Crockett, met with representatives of the Landmarks Commission on Monday evening, July 23rd, to discuss the suggested revisions to our Historic Guidelines. Their offered comments were basically to help us better define what INA envisions as necessary to protect the character and historic integrity of our neighborhood. Along with the historic guidelines, we have the opportunity to submit a "controlled" development plan for our commercial area on Cooper Street to the City Council. It would definitely be in the neighborhood's best interest to submit both to the City Council at the same time.

INA will holding meetings in September and October in order to give all our residents the opportunity to review and comment on the guidelines and development plan. Seventy-two percent of the Idlewild property owners must sign off on them before we can proceed.

As now scheduled, we hope to have the completed guidelines and development plan go before the Landmarks Commission for approval at their November 29th meeting. If approved by Landmarks, both will then go before the Land Use Control Board on December 13th. We are looking at the first City Council meeting in
