ZONING PETITION FOR PROPERTY LOCATED ON CORNER OF TROY & BLUFF ROADS

Our fellow neighbors on the other size of Meridian saw just how important it was to have an association for fighting against these types of things - especially by seeing the victory from our hard-fought battle we were able to accomplish by all coming together as our own community and standing up for ourselves. The boundaries for this Association will run from Meridian to Bluff and from Troy to Pleasant Run Parkway South.

ZONING PETITION FOR PROPERTY LOCATED ON CORNER OF MADISON & PLEASANT RUN NORTH PARKWAY

A continuance has been granted to us with regard to the rezoning petition hearing on this property seeking to rezone it from a C-3 to a C-5. The new hearing date will be May 11^{th} . The Association is very much opposed to this rezoning and highly recommends everyone sign the petition which is being circulated.

Since we have been so successful in getting our streets covered with a Block Captain, it is time to focus on getting some of our other committees up and going. Won't you please consider helping out on one of these committees. Check out the list below and let us know if you would be interested in having your name added to one of them:

- **Membership Committee.** The Membership Committee would also help in getting the newsletters distributed as well as helping to spread the good news about our Association and the many things we are trying to accomplish. The Membership Committee would also include our volunteers to be Block Captains. A future goal of the committee would be to put together a Neighborhood Membership Directory
- **Social/Welcome Committee.** The Committee would welcome new neighbors to the neighborhood, give them neighborhood information such as trash pick-up days, etc. and tell them all about our Association and what we hope to accomplish. The Committee would also plan neighborhood events and/or get togethers.

 Newsletter/Advertising Committee. The Committee would be responsible for our newsletter which will be prepared on bimonthly basis.

• **Block Captains.** The Block Captains would help us in getting the newsletters distributed as well as being a connection between their block neighbors and the Board by letting us know of any concerns of those neighbors or things needing attention in their block. This would not take a great deal of time but is a very valuable position to the Board in helping to spread the good news about our Association and the many things we are trying to accomplish in making our neighborhood beautiful and a fun and safe place to raise our families. Having Block Captains is our No. 1 goal to get accomplished first. At present we are thinking we need at least 9 but the more, the better because it would make the areas covered smaller. In the past, we've had two neighbors volunteer to be the Block Captains for one area, so how about finding yourself a "buddy" and volunteering!

DRIVING AND WALKING SAFETY REMINDERS

With the weather hopefully getting nicer, there will be more and more people out walking as well as children on bicycles. Because we do not have any sidewalks in our neighborhoods and the roads seem to be incredibly narrow at times, here are just a few safety reminders to note yourself as well as pass on to the children.

BICYCLE SAFETY:

- Make sure the bike has back reflectors and a good light
- Remind the children that they should always be driving on the side of the road which is going in the same direction as the cars
- Chains and/or locks for their bikes so they will have the pleasure of using them all summer and not get them stolen

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY:

- Remember to always walk on the side of the road so you are walking into the oncoming traffic (that way if a car is coming too close to you, you will see it and be able to step out of the way).
- If walking early in the morning or late at night, wear something light colored or with reflective tape on it. (Don't assume that because you can see them, they can see you!!)

DRIVING SAFETY:

- If you are driving thru a residential neighborhood, slow down and keep a close eye out for children zooming out of driveways with their bikes or skateboards - you can bet they will not be watching for you!
- If you see someone walking and there are no oncoming cars in the other lane, merge over to that lane to give as wide a berth between your car and the pedestrian.
- If you see someone walking and there is an oncoming car in the other lane, slow down, let that car pass and then merge into that lane to give as wide a berth between your car and the pedestrian.
