It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Title 16 of the General Laws entitled "EDUCATION" is hereby amended 1 2 by adding thereto the following chapter: 3 **CHAPTER 85** 4 RHODE ISLAND COMMUNITY SUPPORTS ACADEMY 5 16-85-1. Academy established - Purpose. -- There is hereby established the Rhode Island supports academy for the purpose of providing education and training for community 6 7 living for individuals with special needs. 8 16-85-2. Control by board of governors for higher education. -- The state board of 9 governors for higher education shall have supervision, administration, and control of the Rhode 10 Island community supports academy. 11 16-85-3. Statewide community supports academy. -- (a) Each city and town (local 12 educational authority) may contract with the Rhode Island community supports academy to 13 establish and operate programs for the education and training including managerial programs. 14 (b) When these programs are operated by the Rhode Island Community Supports 15 Academy each participating city or town shall be assessed for the cost of the program. The 16 assessments shall be deposited in a restricted receipt account for the purpose of funding 17 expenditures necessary to operate the statewide program. 18 16-85-4. Development of Rhode Island community supports academy. -- (a) The 19 commissioner of higher education, and the office of health and human services, executive

2	establish a certification program for entry level workers interested in working with children and
3	adults with special needs and present it to the board of governors for higher education for their
4	approval. The board shall, in developing the academy, consider the following:
5	(1) The establishment of a certification program that includes coursework and a
6	supervised filed placement component; and
7	(2) Content shall encompass the employment needs of hospital and community settings;
8	home based services; children and adult day care settings; school settings; and other settings that
9	work with special needs children and adults.
10	(b) Input of interested parties. In developing the proposal for the Rhode Island
11	community supports academy, the commissioner of higher education and the office of health and
12	human services and the director of Rhode Island department of labor and training shall solicit
13	input from interested parties, including, but not limited to:
14	(1) providers of special needs services;
15	(2) administrators and faculty leaders from institutions of higher education that currently
16	offer coursework and degrees related to special needs for children and adults, including
17	representatives from Brown Medical School, University of Rhode Island, Rhode Island College,
18	Community College of Rhode Island; and
19	(3) Individuals with special needs, their families, and community organizations that
20	support the advancement of special needs individuals.
21	16-85-5. Advisory board (a) The powers delegated and authorized in this chapter for
22	the board of governors for higher education and the department of elementary and secondary
23	education, office of health and human services, Rhode Island department of labor and training
24	shall be in addition to those previously authorized by any other general or public law.
25	(b) The governance, funding, and programming of the Rhode Island Community
26	Supports Academy shall be in accordance with the rules and regulations formulated by the board
27	of governors for higher education pursuant to chapter 35 of title 42.
28	(c) The purpose of this chapter is to structure the governance of the Rhode Island
29	Community Supports Academy.
30	(d) The board of governors for higher education shall appoint the members of the
31	advisory board from nominations made by the commissioner higher education. The chairperson
32	shall also be selected in this manner. The board of governors for higher education shall determine
33	the qualifications and terms of office of members of the board of trustees. The advisory board
34	shall be comprised of eleven (11) individuals, not less than four (4) of whom shall be persons or

secretary and director of Rhode Island labor and training shall jointly develop a proposal to

2	persons or parents, guardians of persons who are special needs from organizations whose
3	membership is primarily made up of parents of special needs individuals, individuals who have
4	special needs, as well as from degree and certificate granting institutions and other sources. For
5	purposes of obtaining input from diverse sources regarding suggestions for nominations for the
6	first advisory board to be nominated by the commissioner, the commissioner shall convene a
7	public forum to obtain broad input prior to making the initial nominations for the founding
8	membership on the advisory board. No person in any way employed by or doing business for
9	monetary gain with the Rhode Island community supports academy may be member of the
10	advisory board. Rhode Island community supports academy, office of health and human services,
11	and the department of labor and training shall serve ex-officio and be non-voting members.
12	(e) The board of governors shall establish strategic directions for the education and
13	training of individuals to work with special needs individuals from birth to death in the state of
14	Rhode Island in consultation with the office of health and human services and the Rhode Island
15	department of labor and training.
16	(f) The board of governors shall provide parameters for budget requests, recommend a
17	budget, and participate in budget development.
18	(1) The commissioner of higher education shall recommend parameters for the overall
19	budget requests, recommend a budget, and participate in budget development.
20	(g) The advisory board shall meet not less than quarterly and serve without
21	compensation. Five (5) members of the advisory board shall be required for quorums. They shall
22	keep records of their meetings and report annually on the progress of the Rhode Island
23	community supports academy to the commissioner, board of governors and the general assembly,
24	and state library.
25	(h) The advisory board shall recommend to the board of governors of higher education
26	consistent with this subsection:
27	(1) To recommend what the needs of the special needs children and adults are in the state
28	of Rhode Island.
29	(2) To recommend educational and training service policies to meet the needs of special
30	needs children and adults served by the graduates of the Rhode Island community supports
31	academy.
32	(3) To recommend policy guidance and suggestions for budget development.
33	(4) To recommend methods which ensure that all students are taught by educators of the
34	highest possible quality.

1	(5) To establish appropriate committees and/or workgroups as needed, to provide
2	guidance and feedback on the goals and outcomes of the Rhode Island Community Supports
3	Academy.
4	(6) To make themselves available to the board of governors of higher education, board of
5	regents, office of health and human services, departments of education, human services, health,
6	elderly affairs, youth and families and local education authorities in order to provide a link
7	between these agencies.
8	(7) The advisory board shall utilize as a guiding document to advise policy, and annually
9	update, the "Issue Brief", 2007.
10	(i) To recommend to the board of governors policies to meet the needs of children and
11	adults with special needs to advise on implementation of policies established by the board of
12	governors and the Rhode Island community supports academy.
13	16-85-6. Reporting deadline The board of governors and the office of health and
14	human services and Rhode Island department of labor and training shall submit a report by
15	January 3, 2008 that includes its findings and recommendations, including an assessment of the
16	size of the market for the certification program, a course of study with particular regard to the
17	credit transferability, a range of financial incentive programs to attract students, and proposed
18	actions and recommendations to the general assembly. Following the receipt and review of the
19	report, the general assembly may report out a bill to the regular session of the 122 <sup>nd</sup> legislature.
20	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
