Thirty-five years ago the National Sheriffs' Association started an initiative in crime prevention to help combat the growing burglary problem in communities. The National Neighborhood Watch program was created as a way for citizens to help law enforcement protect neighborhoods. Community members would be the "extra eyes and ears" of law enforcement in an effort to make neighborhoods safer.

In 2002, USAonWatch was created as an expansion of the National Neighborhood Watch program to empower citizens to become directly involved for the purposes of homeland security and emergency preparedness.

The three Self-Paced training CDs offer training to law enforcement, and the Community CD is designed for training citizens who will be members of the NW groups.
