April 18, 2007 Meeting of the Steering Committee Meeting

8:10 **Greg Murphy** spoke regarding the public works program and gave an overview of projects to be undertaken in the neighborhood.

Lynn Halperin gave an update on the UC/City effort to provide a "move out" function. One of the issues is that there is not a specific day for the move out.

Lynn then presented an overview of the priorities of the UC Task Force: good neighbor relations, dangerous disruption, drinking, trash, and institutionalizing the task for strategy. UC Berkeley is looking to hire a full time employee to institutionalize it. One of the difficulties is how to reach the smaller properties without on-site managers or landlords. Another issue is storage space between the closing of the dorm and the opening of new apartments. Lastly, the student judicial process has been shortened—the turn around time for the police to SJA will now be two weeks.

The Communications Committee is working on a web site. The Education Committee working on landlord-substance abuse material.

Motion Beier/Pellegrin: Send Cummins a letter of recognition for the work on his behalf.

Organizational Structure of the WNA: Sharon Hudson spoke re: how to get items on the agenda and how to work with special guests / observers. **#2 Passed unanimously** – the 72 hour agenda item.

BRT – **Chris Ganson** suggested that it might not be a good time for a vote for forum of support / not support, because the EIR is not yet out. Chris walked through the "pros" of the BRT and spoke of the differences the between the BRT and Enhanced Bus.
