Because our annual elections did not take place last month, and in order to maintain active status with the City of Tucson, this special meeting was held to discuss types of leadership structures, requests for nominations, and recruiting techniques for the leadership positions needed for Dodge/ Flower N.A. In attendance were 15 Dodge/Flower members, George Pettit - Ward 3, Levonne Gaddy - Dept. of Neighborhood Resources (DNR), Judith Anderson - PRO Neighborhoods, and Blanche White - Oak Flower N.A.

We are grateful for the active status extension granted by DNR while we work on forming new leadership. Our long-established relationships with the City, County, TPD, and other neighborhood groups are too precious to throw away.

Our bylaws dictate the structure of our leadership. Therefore, any change from the traditional board of officers will require notification to the membership to be voted upon by qualified voting members. If we decide to make a change, the process will take months.

### Your June Safety Message from the Tucson Fire Department

#### Preventing Heat-Related Deaths & Injuries in the Car

- Never leave your child or pet in an unattended car, even with the windows down.
- Teach children not to play in or around cars.
- Always lock car doors and trunks even at home.
- Be wary of child-resistant locks. Teach older children how to disable the driver's door locks if they unintentionally become entrapped in a motor vehicle.
- Check to make sure all children leave the vehicle when you reach your destination.
- Don't over look sleeping infants.
- Watch children closely around cars, particularly when loading and unloading.
- Make sure you check the temperature of the car seat surface and safety belt buckles before restraining your children in the car.

Remember that households cannot have more than 4 yard sales within a 12 month period. Having them more often than that is considered a business, so a City of Tucson business license is required.

Speaking of clutter, when the sale is over, please be sure to remove all your signs.
