Computer REuse/recycling And Marketing CREAM

Clark County residents may now donate their used computer systems to the community by taking their computers and related hardware to the Clark County Jail Work Center to be evaluated for reuse or recycling. The Jail Work Center is located at 5197 NW Lower River Road and is open for donations Monday – Thursday, from 9:00-11:30 am and 1:00-4:00 pm. There is no charge for City of Vancouver and Clark County residents if the computers are from their households. Additionally, residents may recycle their old television sets and other household electronics at this location.

Reusable computers will be reconfigured and loaded with a free operating system, then donated to community members in need through the Salvation Army. Non-working computers and computers that do not meet the standard for reuse will be recycled responsibly. The CREAM program is possible through the cooperation of Clark County, the City of Vancouver, Clark College, Clark County Jail Work Center, Waste Connections, The Salvation Army and Columbia Resource Company.
