Annual Clean-up Day – October 13, 2007

What is the Neighborhood Clean-up? Here's the information – straight from the city's handbook for neighborhood association leaders: All active city neighborhood associations are eligible to schedule a clean-up one Saturday each year. The garbage company provides the truck and driver and the neighborhood association is responsible for providing volunteer staffing and for publicizing the event in the neighborhood newsletter. The truck can be used to collect and dispose of yard debris or bulky items. The truck cannot be used for disposal of household garbage, unless your association decides to target its clean-up for a specific site within your neighborhood. Large amounts of concrete or roofing cannot be collected at Neighborhood Clean-ups.

Some stats from the 2007 clean-up:

3 truckloads of bulky items, totaling **12.19** tons

2 drop boxes of yard debris, totaling **1.15** tons

Disposal cost was **\$998.24** – this is money our neighbors *didn't* have to pay to get rid of junk!
