

HEALTHY HOUSING COLLABORATIVE 2007 ACTIVITIES REPORT

This document contains a brief summary of the activities conducted with members of the Healthy Housing Collaborative during 2007. Special thanks to members of the Collaborative who provide ongoing support, input, ideas and time to promote healthy housing in Rhode Island.

I. Milestones of the year

- Issued the "Healthy Housing: Why RI should invest in the vision" report in January 2007
- Reviewed and prioritized recommendations included in the report
- Prepared an action plan with the priorities
- Membership grew significantly due to the merge with members of the Asthma Control Program workgroup, the Lead Program's Advisory Committee and leadership from the Department of Health
- Selected two co-chairs for the Collaborative: Nancy Sutton and Magaly Angeloni. Both are members of the Department of Health's Healthy Housing Steering Committee, along with Robert Vanderslice, PhD and Peter Simon, MD.
- Formed a group to help prepare a grant proposal to conduct Healthy Housing Summits in 2008 and 2009. The proposal was submitted in December 2007 and notices will be received in March 2008.
- Issued a Progress Report in November 2007, which measures housing in relation to the elimination of lead poisoning in the state.
- Presented the Healthy Housing strategy and structure in RI at the Asthma Regional Council, which gathered regional representatives from the Asthma program as well as regional representatives of the federal agencies (HUD, EPA, CDC).
- Became involved in 17 activities, which are ongoing, as detailed in the next section (I actually don't think this is a milestone and would consider deleting)
- Established 5 groups to work on specific activities, as indicated on page 3

1.	Working with the National Center for Healthy Housing (NCHH) and others in the development of a healthy housing indicator for evaluation purposes. Indicators could be used for a statewide housing database in the future	NCHH is working on identifying funding to support this effort.
2.	Maintaining the Healthy Housing Collaborative formed by representatives from agencies throughout the state that are interested in housing, health care, community and policy issues	Ongoing
3.	Using the Family Assessment form to collectenvironmental indicator data from the homes visited by the Family Outreach Program. This form was revised and implemented in July 2006	Ongoing.
4.	Analyzing the data collected through the Family Outreach Program	Results were presented in Sept. 07. Another analysis is planned for 2008.
5.	Working with Head Start Agencies to collect the same environmental data already being collected by the Family Outreach Program	Head Start agencies agreed to begin collecting data in Fall 2007. Will submit June 08.
6.	Working with RI Legal Services in the formulation of a strategy to educate judges about healthy housing	Informational session offered to District Court Judges in Sept 2007 and to RI Legal Services attorneys in Dec 07.
7.	Working on the Landlord/Tenant handbook which includes sections on healthy housing	HRC working on it.
8.	Assessing the effectiveness of a proposed "healthy housing report card" for cities and towns	Testing a few approaches.
