On Tuesday, August 26, 2008 at approximately 8:57
p.m. BPD responded to a report of a strong arm
robbery that had just occurred at the
intersection of Dwight and Bowditch. The female
victim had been grabbed from behind by a male suspect who put her in a choke hold. The other
two suspects, a male and a female, took the
victims backpack and belongings. The suspects
were last seen running eastbound on Dwight Way
and possibly entered a dark colored SUV. UCPD
and BPD searched the area but were unable to
locate the suspects. The victim was not injured during the encounter.
The suspects are described as: Suspect #1 & #2 Black males, 18-20 years of
age, with a thin build, wearing dark hooded sweatshirts and baggy jeans. Suspect #3 A Black female, 18-20 years of age,
with a thin build, wearing a dark hooded sweatshirt and baggy jeans.
