On Wednesday, December 3, 2008 at 1:30 a.m. BPD responded to a report of an altercation involving 4 Black or Hispanic males beating a male victim at the intersection of Dwight and Dana. One of the suspects displayed a knife. BPD Officers arrived on scene, however they could not locate the victim or the suspects. A short time later the victim contacted BPD via a cell phone and stated that he was at the intersection of Shattuck and Adeline. BPD arrived on scene and discovered that the victim had been beaten and was suffering from a stab wound. BFD was contacted and transported the victim to the hospital. BPD searched the area but was unable to find the suspect.

The victim was unable to give a further description of the suspects.
