On Tuesday, February 11, 2009, at 7:58 PM BPD received a report of an armed robbery which had just occurred on Hillegass at the intersection of Dwight Way. The male victim was walking on Hillegass when he was approached from behind by someone who demanded his property. The victim complied by giving the suspect his iPod and cell phone and the suspect fled the scene on Hillegass towards People's Park. Although a weapon was not seen, the victim believed the suspect was armed. The victim was not harmed during the encounter. BPD and UCPD searched the area but were unable to locate the suspect.

The suspect was described as:

A White male, 6'01" in height, approximately 25 years of age, with a medium build, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and jeans.
