There has been an increase in graffiti in this area. The obvious best way to stop graffiti is take steps to make sure it does not happen. We have a very competent and concerned SAAFE officer. If you can provide Officer Bender any information that might help her, give her a call. Call 311 to report occurrences. Finally prompt removal is another key to stopping this mess. The City has provided tools, such as a power washer and approved "graffiti wipes" to use on traffic signs paint etc. It takes people, are you interested?

"Walk around crime" is on the rise. There is credible evidence that the chances are pretty good that if you leave your car on the street OR in your driveway, the doors will be checked to see if they are unlocked. If unlocked, selected items will be taken. The scary part is your garage door opener will most likely be taken. You can complete the possible scenarios from here.

Graffiti is Back in Valencia

As probably everyone is aware, graffiti is a problem in and around Valencia. Removing the graffiti depends on what the "artists" used but most comes off easily with a spray made just for graffiti removal. The city has a crew that will remove it from signs, but they are also providing kits to subdivisions that want to remove the graffiti themselves rather than wait for the city to remove it. These kits include special wipes to be used on street signs. The chemical on the wipe does not remove the reflective coating. These wipes are the only city-approved way to remove the graffiti from the street signs. The Valencia Neighborhood Association has requested one of these kits.

Currently, the Association has the spray that can be used on transformers and cable boxes. Let us know if you see graffiti on any transformers or cable boxes. If your fence gets tagged with graffiti and you don't have access to a power washer, there are several Valencia board members who are willing to power wash your fence.

The more quickly the graffiti disappears, the less likely the taggers will come back to do more art work in the neighborhood. Contact Dianne Johnson at 655-2327 for more information.

Senior Citizen Center & City Service Center Opens

The City of San Antonio opened the Community Link Service Center this past summer. It is located at Oakridge Plaza, 11220 Perrin-Beitel, Suite 112, and is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM. and on Saturday from 10:00 AM until 6:00 PM. The main phone number is 210-207-5165.

There are some people who still are not aware of their services and are still driving downtown to get Garage sale permits, birth certificates, pay parking tickets, and obtain many other services. Nearly every city government department is represented at this Center. The following services at this center cover Building Inspections, Code Compliance, Health, Human Services,

Municipal Courts, Park and Recreation, Public Works, Environmental, Police Reports, and VIA. You can purchase VIA passes and tickets at this location. If you are interested in obtaining a job with the City of San Antonio, check on available jobs and fill out an application at this Service Center.

We need to use the services of this facility if we want to keep it. **USE IT OR LOSE IT!**

The Northeast Senior Citizen Center has a target date for opening on April 1, 2009. It will be located in an existing building at 4355 Center Gate. This is the second road on the right driving on Perrin-Beitel from I-410. There is a traffic light at this intersection. The City of San Antonio has approved a \$200,000 amount for the 2009 budget year and increased funding is expected in future years. The District 10 Senior Citizens Committee is working on identifying items/services we would like to see at the center. One of the top priority items will be a Comprehensive Nutrition Program which will provide health and wellness information and a balanced nutritious lunch for only 50 cents.

We will continue to keep you posted on the progress and development of the new Senior Citizen Center.

Responsible Pet Ownership

Pets can be a rewarding addition to any family, but they come with responsibilities. Courtesy and respect are part of being a good neighbor and also a necessity when it comes to pet ownership.

Abiding by leash laws and cleaning up animal waste are some of the courtesies that residents should provide. Another is making sure that pets don't disturb the peace by barking or howling at inappropriate times.

If you haven't used a bag to clean up after your pet before, here are some simple instructions:



Step 1

Place your hand inside the plastic bag and simply scoop up the waste. Your hand is protected by the bag.

Step2

Turn the bag inside out (there should be no waste on the outside of the bag) and knot the open end.

Step3

Take the waste bag home with you and simply discard in your trash.

LET'S DO THE PET WASTE MATH!

 \sim 150 dogs in Valencia + 3/4 lb of waste per day per dog (Kitsap Co. statistical average)

+ 50% of all pet owners in Valencia walk their dogs in public places*

+ Up to 40% of dog owners DO NOT pick up after their pet*

How does it add up?

150 X 3/4 pounds = 113 pounds of dog waste DAILY in Valencia

50% in public places X 40% not picking up =

23 pounds of waste left behind in yours, and your neighbors lawn daily!

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

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
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
