



Impact on city, schools and county. \$6.1 billion in stimulus package dollars to Georgia. Revamped unemployment benefits to extend benefits. Governor's budget raises property taxes across state next year. Added more homestead exemptions for Fulton and Dekalb.
  - Lack of pickup truck seat belt law costing state \$10 million a year.
  - Stimulus dollars coming to public transportation and MARTA will get some but not enough to offset budget shortfall. ARC made \$27 million available to MARTA for the current year budget.

Considering plans to reduce service and increase fares. Fiscal year ends June 30. State law currently requires 50% capital and 50% operations. Bills have been introduced to allow change. Bill to allow vending in stations passed Senate now in House. (HB277 and SB 39). May 18 and 19 holding public meetings to allow community input on service cuts and fare increases. Proposed changes are from \$1.75 to \$2.00; 7-day from \$13 to \$15 of \$17; 30-day from \$52.50 to \$64.00. Community Outreach Meeting on March 30. Dr. Scott to present decisions made by Board based on public input. MARTA fares are a little lower than other cities which are about \$2.00. There has been no increase in MARTA fares since 2001. There is currently a hiring freeze and there may be lay-offs or furloughs.

# **Elected Officials' Report**

#### **§ H. Lamar Willis Crime**

Issue ~ Putting legislation for a Show Cause before we reduce our police force. The mayor can't reduce the public safety until there is a hearing. Looking to do a CID community improvement district. The midtown CID is what helped midtown become a strong viable neighborhood. The funds allowed them to create midtown Blue that enables them to have additional police support. They can't necessarily change the impact of the mayor's actions. The legislation was introduced before the furloughs were enacted. The fifty million dollar budget shortfall was coming before the economy started to fail. The sales tax rate would have to be increased from 7-8% to make a impact on the budget.

He is not the chair of the public safety committee but he is on the committee. Cleta Winslow is the chair of public safety.

The mayor has the ultimate control of the budget and the accounting system that is not working. The budget issues lay with the chief executive and the council. If we had more at large council members then the mayor's power would not be so strong.
