A Walk in Glen Echo Ravine

One nice day in June, I followed my curiosity to look at the Glen Echo creek restoration project.

My walk began at the east side of Calumet school and took me along the wooded walkway on the upper edge of the ravine. When I came to the west side of the Indianola overpass, I noticed that the ugly, tall concrete overflow pipe has been replaced by a short gully, and a rock bed has been laid for the stream to resurface from its underground path. It continues its run to the Olen-tangy channeled by the interesting shale valley.

I continued my walk east of the bridge, and followed the gentle curvature of the creek to the steep incline towards 4th Street...a definite cardio workout. The creek bed has been restored to follow its glacial groove allowing the water to sometimes meander, sometimes gush through the park. The restoration is well on its way!

A further issue that I see is the invasive plants that have taken over much of the ravine. I would like to suggest that we get information on how to eliminate invasive plants in the ravine to help native plants thrive in their place. Glen Echo ravine is a precious green space in our neighborhood....let's make it ready for other curious visitors!

Details of the alley treatments most of the U.C.A.N. area will receive this August:

Location of 18 alleys to be Surface Treated

- Alley North of Tibet from East St. to Calumet
- Alley North Tibet from Druid to the Alley East of Indianola
- Alley North of Tulane Rd. from the Alley West of Indianola to the Alley East of High St.
- Alley North of Crestview from the Alley West of Indianola to the Alley East of High St.
- Alley North of Kelso from the Alley West of Indianola to High St.
- Alley South of Kelso from the Alley West of Indianola to High St.
- Alley West of Indianola from the Alley South of Olentangy to Weber Rd.
- 2nd Alley West of Indianola from the Alley South of Olentangy to the Alley North of Olentangy
- Alley South of Olentangy St. from the Alley West of Indianola to Calumet
- 3rd Alley West of Indianola from the Alley South of Olentangy to Olentangy
- Alley West of Medary from the Alley North of Olentangy St. to the 2nd Alley North of Olentangy
- Alley West of Calumet from the Alley North of Olentangy St. to the 2nd Alley North of Olentangy
- Alley West of Adams from Olentangy St. to the 2nd Alley North of Olentangy St.
- Alley North of Olentangy St. from Medary to Adams Ave.
- Alley North of Olentangy St. from Adams Ave. to the Alley East of High St.
- Alley West of Findley from Olentangy St. to the 2nd Alley North of Olentangy St.
- Alley West of East Ave. from Olentangy St. to the Alley North of Tulane Rd.
- Alley North of Olentangy St. from the Alley East of High St. to High St.

Pre-Surface/ Surface/ Post Surface Treatment Process –22-28 days

Maintenance of Traffic/Notification

No driveways will be blocked – all work is performed using a “rolling set-up”. Plantings and structures within the right-of-way will be avoided, but may be disturbed and removed as necessary. City Code does not permit the placement of items within the City right-of-way.

Formal notice of work to be performed by the City is not issued. Local community groups provide notification to the constituents affected by work performed. Generally, once you see “brush cutting” in your area, you have approximately 2 weeks to remove items from the City’s right-of-way.
