3/4 pound of margarine

- I cup of white sugar
- I box of cornstarch
- I cup of flour
- I level teaspoon of baking powder
- I teaspoon of vanilla
- 3 egg yolks

Preparation Method:

Preheat your oven to 350 degrees. Cream the margarine in a large mixing bowl, and then add the sugar and mix well. Continue mixing as you add the egg yolks. In a separate bowl, mix all the dry ingredients together, and then add by spoonfuls to the creamy mixture as you continue mixing with a large spoon. Lastly, add the vanilla and mix until the cookie dough has a uniform consistency.

Your cookie dough can now be divided and tinted with food coloring. I suggest a light pink or a greenish-yellow, but you can make them any color. Red and green would be good for Christmas. Shoot the dough through a cookie gun onto a baking sheet. If you don't have a cookie gun, you can drop the dough onto a baking sheet with a teaspoon. Bake the cookies at 350 degrees for five minutes. Cool and ENJOY!
