

A little about our neighbors from Shalom Park

I've always wondered about Shalom Park and asked Jody Neumann, a Woodgate South neighbor(and also the volunteer coordinator for Shalom Park), to share with us a little about the community.

Shalom Park is a retirement community just West of Woodgate South. There are about 250 residents living in the community. Services are provided to the Senior Residences (apartment building and patio homes) on an a la carte basis. Jody commented, "The Beth Israel Nursing home has single rooms as well as suites where some married couples still live together". Not all of the residents are Jewish. They have several Russian speaking residents and a former Russian MD who volunteers to socialize with those

residents. Another interesting fact is that they have the largest kosher kitchen between Kansas City and San Francisco.

In addition to the nursing staff, Shalom Park employs a full time MD, 3 nurse practitioners, 6 social workers, a Psychologist, a Rabbi, a Chaplain, a Music Therapist, and an activity staff of 14 people. They have 1/10th the turnover typical of the industry. Volunteers are always welcome.

When asked about the expansion that was supposed to start last year, Jody commented that it has been postponed until further notice.

Shelley's gardening tips!

- Clean up the garden and remove any diseased foliage. Remove dead annuals and cut back perennials to three inches. Herbs can be left over the winter and cut back in early spring.
- Rake leaves from lawn as soon as the trees are bare. Leaves are rich in the nutrients your plants love; make good use of all those leaves by using them as compost for mulching over winter. Water lawn ¾ inches a week if the weather is dry. Fertilize lawn if it is green and the ground is not frozen.
- Fall is the best time of year for planting new trees and shrubs. Plant bulbs now for spring and early summer flowering. Wait until soil temperatures reach about 60F before planting.
- Dry cold is one of the harshest conditions plants can experience. When the temperature is above freezing, water all your landscape plants, giving them a thorough soaking. Remember to disconnect the hose to prevent freezing.
