

he Disabled American Veterans is planning to hold a Veterans Seminar on Monday, March 8th at 10 AM in the Atrium.

The seminar will explain current veteran, spouse and widow benefits. The speaker will be a DAV National Service Office from the St. Petersburg VA Regional Office. Topics to be discussed include, **pensions**, **service connected compensations**, **Aid and Attendance**, **VA medical care and widow/ widower benefits**.

There have been recent changes in VA regulations that affect all Veteran veterans and their spouses with regard to type 2 diabetes, heart disease, PTSD, cancers,



ALS and Parkinson's Disease. All veterans exposed to gunfire and aircraft noise may be eligible for hearing aids and compensation.

At the close of the seminar there will be several DAV Service Officers available to assist veterans and their spouses fill out forms for benefits and compensation that they may be entitled to.

For all disabled veterans over age 80, the DAV is offering a free membership at this seminar.

Celebrating St. Patrick's Day: The Irish in America

The Irish have been immigrating to America since before there was a United States. People from Scotland came as a result of the First Irish Plantation (land which was taken from the Irish and given to people transplanted from Scotland). This early wave of Scots-Irish came to the "colonies" when they became unhappy with their treatment by the British.

By the 19th Century, the English owned the majority of land in Ireland. When the mainstay of the Irish diet, the potato, failed; destitute and starving Irish immigrated to North America. By 1910 there were more people of Irish descent in New York City than Dublin's whole population.

They settled in large cities in the East, in Canada, the Great Lakes area, and the Midwest. They worked as



manual laborers on canals, railroads, streets, sewers, and bridges. They found employment in police and fire departments and other public works of major cities. The women worked as maids, nursemaids, and in textile mills. The Irish immigrants started low on the social scale, and were discriminated against. But they worked hard and grew consistently until they ranked toward the top of the social hierarchy.

Irish soldiers in the British army March 17, 1762 celebrated New York's first St. Patrick's Day parade. The First St. Patrick's Day parade in Boston was organized on March 17, 1766. Today, St. Patrick's Day is widely maries by Lich and non Lich alike. Pagendless of otheric healternand

celebrated in America by Irish and non-Irish alike. Regardless of ethnic background, many people wear green and sport shamrocks. Traditionally, when one is caught not wearing green on St. Patrick's Day they are pinched, usually affectionately.
