



## Florida Driver's License Information

Nora Adell Andrews

n January 1, 2010 the federal government enacted a law requiring every state to set up a system to ensure that its citizens have what is called a "**Real ID**". Florida is the first state to comply. It



is almost like going for your first license, with documents that can be difficult to locate.

A few years ago some of you may remember Judy Ellis, who came to our park to help us write a living will. She came several times and with a notary got many living wills done here in the park. This was free; because of a grant she had been given. However, this time there is no grant, and she has formed a small company called "RENEW—4U; at 727-460-1586" Please feel free to call her if you may need help locating the necessary papers, forms from other states, or even here in Florida. She will be glad to answer any questions.

You will need to go into a Driver's License office with all of the following documents:

- 1. Original or certified copy of your birth certificate. (BRING ONE): (A hospital birth certificate is not acceptable) OR A current, valid US Passport. Legal name change (if applicable) Original or certified copy of all marriage certificates or court orders that show name changes. (Uncertified photocopies are not valid)
- 2. Proof of your social security number: (BRING ONE): Social security card; W-2 form showing your name and social security number.
- 3. Proof of residential address (BRING TWO) The address can no longer be a post office box. Florida voter registration card; Florida vehicle registration or title; W-2 form; Utility bill; Current automobile or homeowner's insurance policy or bill; Mail from financial institutions; Medical or health card with address listed;

That is **FOUR documents** you need. If you are missing any of these or have changed your name and don't have proof to show that change was legal, you may need help to renew your license or your ID card. The fees will vary depending on what you are missing and how complicated it will be to get that paperwork. If you were born before 1935, you are exempt from this law, but you should take documents that you already have, even though the birth certificate may not be certified (which they didn't do in "the olden days"). The REAL ID that you get will get you into a federal building and on an airplane and is necessary by the year 2017.

Health.com reports that Dr. Michael Miller, a professor of medicine and director of the Center for Preventive Cardiology at the University of Maryland Medical Center in Baltimore, has observed that listening to "joyful" music can improve a person's blood flow, which may promote vascular health.
