#### 3479 Civil Code

Anything which is injurious to health, including, but not limited to, the illegal sale of controlled substances, or is indecent or offensive to the senses, or an obstruction to the free use of property, so as to interfere with the comfortable enjoyment of life or property, or unlawfully obstructs the free passage or use, in the customary manner, of any navigable lake, or river, bay, stream, canal, or basin, or any public park, square, street, or highway, is a nuisance.



#### 3480 Civil Code

A public nuisance is one which affects at the same time an entire community or neighborhood, or any considerable number of persons, although the extent of the annoyance or damage inflicted upon individuals may be unequal.



#### **731 Code of Civil Procedure**

An action may be brought by any person whose property is injuriously affected, or whose personal enjoyment is lessened by a nuisance, as the same is defined in section thirty-four hundred and seventynine of the Civil Code, and by the judgment in such action the nuisance may be enjoined or abated as well as damages recovered therefore.



A civil action may be brought in the name of the people of the State of California to abate a public nuisance, as the same is defined in section thirty-four hundred and eighty of the Civil Code, by the district attorney of any county in which such nuisance exists, or by the city attorney of any town or city in which such nuisance exists,



and each of said officers shall have concurrent right to bring such action for a public nuisance existing within a town or city, and such district attorney, or city attorney, of any county or city in which such nuisance exists must bring such action whenever directed by the board of supervisors of such county or whenever directed by the legislative authority of such town or city.



Using the Civil Court process we have successfully abated:

- A problem bar
- A problem Rave Club
- A gang house
- A problem apartment complex
- A problem drug house
- A problem Smoke Shop



Our latest action is very ambitious.

We are working with a community group that wants to use the Civil Court process to force the local school district to become a responsible neighbor.



### Civil Court Process

#### What are the various remedies?

- Abating the activity
- Sale of the property
- Changing the Operating of the business
- Eviction of the problem tenant
- Hiring a professional management company
- Hiring security guards
- Filing a Small Claims Court complaint



## Property Management

California State Law

Dictates that "a property owner responsibility is to use the property in an ordinary and reasonable manner that is conducive to the Peace and Harmony of the neighborhood and does not interfere with the comfortable enjoyment of life or property."



#### Nuisance

Anything injurious to health

Indecent to the five senses

Unlawfully obstructs free use of streets

 Obstruction to free use of property so as to interfere with the comfortable enjoyment of life or property



#### **Emotional and Mental Distress**

- Mental distress, anguish, pain; loss of enjoyment
- Includes all highly unpleasant mental reactions:
  - Fright, horror, grief
  - Shame humiliation, embarrassment
  - Anger, disappointment, worry



# Activities Associated with Problem Business

- Racing/Speeding Cars
- Noise night and day
- Short-term auto/people traffic
- Offensive encounters with drug-dealers/buyers
- Increase in litter, trash, graffiti, broken bottles,
   Condoms, abandoned/non-operating vehicles,
   associated with drug use.....
- Property deteriorating or not maintained
- Increase in crime & violence
- Afraid to go outside or freely use the streets
- Property values decrease

- "Crack-in-the-box" Drug House
- "Walk-and-drop" Drug House
- "Drug delivery service" Drug House
- Three-person facilitated sales

### **Court Presentation**

- I. Introduce your neighborhood, the problem business and how the business of drugs operated in your neighborhood
- II. Introduce what you did to help stop the problem business from operating in your neighborhood
- III. Introduce what emotional and mental distress you suffered from the problem business and how it prevented you from enjoying the quiet enjoyment of life and property



# The Judge Will Want to Know

- How bad was the problem business?
- When did the problem business property owner learn of the problem?
- What did the problem business property owner do to correct the problem?
- How fast did he do it?



## Awarding of Judgement

- Judgment is made for <u>EACH</u> case and not as a group
- Each judgement is made by the judge based on how well the plaintiff demonstrates: (Log Information & Police Reports)
  - a. How has the plaintiff suffered
  - b. How often the plaintiff suffered
  - c. How long the plaintiff has suffered
  - d. Has the suffering ended?
  - e. How well did the defendant respond
