Fox Canyon Parks Subcommittee Report (2003)



(tributary to greater Chollas Creek)










A Fox Canyon Park System





The San Diego Police Department

- In partnership with the SDPD and our Neighborhood Watch Block Captains, we have been able to keep our Crime Rate low, once again.
 - Our deep gratitude to Mid-City Captain Bob Kanaski; CRO's Pat Norris, Jim Tulumello, Officer Johnson and all the bit officers for keeping Fox Canyon crime FREE.





- In partnership with the Neighborhood Prosecution Unit (in lead to the SDPD and NCCD) the Association was able to silence and vacate FOUR (4) NUISANSE properties in 2005, for a grand total of 43 to date since 2000.

- Right next to police work, Code Enforcement is needed second to none to improve the quality of life and living conditions in the neighborhood.
- In FY-05 Fox Canyon Code Enforcement opened 132 cases, closed 87, and has 45 cases pending with a 65% rate of success.
 - Tonight, we honor one of our own,
 George Andrade for his hard, dedicated and proactive work on behalf of Fox Canyon.

The Environmental Services Department

- In partnership with the City Environmental Services Department, we removed 59.77 tons of trash from the neighborhood in October 15, 2005;
- We successfully organized **THREE** neighborhood cleanups
- And collected 476 pieces of abandoned property from the streets of Fox Canyon.

- To Continue working until Auburn Creek [University/Euclid] is fully restored.




