PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

June/July 2010

Valencia is looking good!

Most yards are green and growing, even if some of the green is weeds. There is not much that we can do about the weeds at this time of year except pull the tall ones and keep mowing so that the ground will hold together and avoid mud.

A short but timely article by Mark Peterson on the SAWS website points out that "after the worst drought on record, the sixth wettest fall and winter and the coldest temperature we've had in the last twenty years, you'd think plants throughout our landscape couldn't have possible fared well. Alas, this is not true."

The article continues and points out the plants that withstood mother nature's wrath so that when we replant we can do it wisely.

The plants that seemed to survive were:

- Ornamental grasses such as Lindheimer's muhly and Mexican feather grass as well as Bermuda.
- 2. Native shrubs like salvia, cenzo and sumac.
- 3. Some non-native species such a mutabilis rose, blue bush germander and Chinese fringe plant.
- 4. All native trees (including the Arizona Ash).





HURRICANE SEASON IS COMING TO SOUTH TEXAS

JUNE I THROUGH NOVEMBER 30

If a hurricane is likely in your area, you should:

- ☑ Listen to the radio or TV for information.
- ☑ Secure your home, close storm shutters, and secure outdoor objects or bring them indoors.
- ☑ Turn off utilities if instructed to do so. Otherwise, turn the refrigerator thermostat to its coldest setting and keep its doors closed.
- Turn off propane tanks. Avoid using the phone, except for serious emergencies.
- ✓ Moor your boat if time permits.
- Ensure a supply of water for sanitary purposes such as cleaning and flushing toilets. Fill the bathtub and other containers with water.

You should evacuate under the following conditions:

- ☑ If you are directed by local authorities to do so. Be sure to follow their instructions.
- ☑ If you live in a mobile home or temporary structure such shelters are particularly hazardous during hurricanes no matter how well fastened to the ground.
- ☑ If you live in a high-rise building hurricane winds are stronger at higher elevations.
- ☑ If you live on the coast, on a flood plain, near a river, or on an inland waterway.
- ☑ If you feel you are in danger.

If you are unable to evacuate, go to your safe room. If you do not have one, follow these guidelines:

- Stay indoors during the hurricane and away from windows and glass doors.
- Close all interior doors secure and brace external doors.
- ☑ Keep curtains and blinds closed. Do not be fooled if there is a lull; it could be the eye of the storm—winds will pick up again.
- ☑ Take refuge in a small interior room, closet, or hallway on the lowest level.
- ☑ Lie on the floor under a table or another sturdy object.

Prepare a Kit of Emergency Supplies

Water

- One gallon of water per person per day, for drinking and sanitation
- Children, nursing mothers, and sick people may need more water.
- If you live in a warm weather climate more water may be necessary.
- Store water tightly in clean plastic containers such as soft drink bottles
- Keep at least a three-day supply of water per person

Food

- Store at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Select foods that require no refrigeration, preparation or cooking and little or no water
- Pack a manual can opener and eating utensils

Choose foods your family will eat:

- 1. Ready-to-eat canned meats, fruits & vegetables
- 2. Protein or fruit bars
- 3. Dry cereal or granola
- 4. Peanut butter
- 5. Dried fruit
- 6. Nuts
- 7. Crackers
- 8. Canned juices
- 9. Non-perishable pasteurized milk
- 10. High energy foods
- 11. Vitamins
- 12. Food for infants
- 13. Comfort/stress foods
