Board of Directors Meeting Minutes February 4, 2010

Before the meeting began, president Tim Allen asked new parliamentarian C. J. Parrish to read some guidelines for conduct of the meeting. The reading included such rules as speaking only after being recognized by the chair, identifying oneself when speaking, turning off cell phones and the like.

Then the meeting commenced at 7:36 p.m. Tim noted that, since the January meeting had lacked a quorum, there were two sets of minutes to be accepted. They were.

Treasurer Brian Butler delivered the treasurer's report, which is attached below.

Officer Marc Hall delivered the crime report, which also is attached below. The good news, he said, is that people are doing a better job of locking their vehicles. The bad news is that they still are leaving valuables in plain sight inside the vehicles, and miscreants are breaking the windows to get the goods.

Metro Councilwoman Tina Ward-Pugh said she has applied for a grant from E.on U.S. that would permit planting of 100 redbuds on a problem bank in the Cochran Hill area. She'll involve Mike Hayman, a tree expert associated with Whitehall historic home on the project.

She also announced that the United Crescent Hill Ministries is trying to raise \$7,000 from donors, in order to secure matching money of \$3 for every dollar raised, from the Metro Government and LG&E. "Your \$7,000 turns into \$28,000," she said. The money must be raised by April.

Tim introduced Sally Marcum, who will be a new district rep from the Kennedy Park District. She said she got involved in Kathleen Batsel's park project there and decided to take it a step further and become involved in the council. George and Millie Kaelin will share a district rep's job, also in the Kennedy district.

New Business

Barb Sinai moved approval of the previously elected officers and members of the board of directors of the Crescent Hill Community Council – a list which includes district reps, committee chairs and others – and the whole slate was approved by a vote. A list of the names of those approved is attached below, courtesy of Barbara McGee, council historian.

District Representative Reports

Sue Ritman reported that Reservoir Park was close to distributing a new neighborhood phone directory. Volunteers gathered the information for the directory going door to door, then designed and laid out the document. Sue solicited donations from businesses on Frankfort Avenue and managed to raise the money to cover the project.

Paul Kinsley said a business in St. Matthews has expressed an interest in working with the Hillcrest district to match money raised for UCHM at the district's Halloween event.

Committee Reports

Beautification committee chair Cabrina Bosco said her committee is working with the Center for Neighborhoods on the PAINT program –Producing Art in Neighborhoods Together – which finds pieces of property whose owners are willing to have public art projects undertaken on them. They will attend a workshop and meet with artists, and then discuss proposals. The hope is one art project will be put into place next Spring.

Barb Sinai, of the Neighborhood Planning Committee, said a turn-of-the-century house on S. Hite will be demolished because it is beyond repair and replaced by something that is getting an architect's attention now. She said a new condominium building with some retail space is planned for a vacant lot on Weiser Avenue, and that neighbors are talking with the developer about it.

Membership chair Jerry Fielden said the council has 350 members. He praised Barb McGee's effort in getting businesses on the council discount card, which he said was mailed to members recently.

Newsletter advertising manager Darrell Anne Driskill said she has brought two new advertisers on board.

Joanne Walker called for volunteers to help put together a council float for FABA's annual Easter Parade, which is April 3. Walgreen's always gives \$50 worth of candy to be distributed from the float, she said.

Kathy Schmitt said the Fourth of July committee is beating the bushes for fireworks money. Paul Kinsley said he is forming an exploratory committee within the Fourth of July Committee to begin looking at a fourth of July event for 2011. Pat Brinson said 21 artists have signed up so far for the 2010 event.

At Large Representatives

Kathleen Batsel, of Kennedy Park, said her group has raised nearly \$20,000, and has shrubbery from the Crescent Hill Garden Club to be planted next year. They'll need some volunteer muscle to get that done. Also the three new park benches will put in place at the top of the park, and MSD has agreed to remediate the park's drainage problems. And there is talk of a Kennedy Park ice cream social sometime this year.

The meeting adjourned at 8:50 p.m.
