Quiet Zone Update

As you know, residents, neighborhood leaders, Metro Officials and our office have worked over the last two and a half years to ensure that we keep the No Train Horn Zone (Quiet Zone) along Frankfort Avenue. Twenty-five years ago Railroad Officials and Metro Officials had a handshake agreement to not blow train horns along this two and a half mile stretch. Over the last five to seven years the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) has tightened up the regulation of Quiet Zones across the country. As of today, all requirements to keep the Ninth District Quiet Zone

intact have been completed: six- inch median curbs where the tracks cross Frankfort Avenue, the closure of Claremont Avenue, crossing gates at Blackburn Avenue, closure of the Franck Avenue. Alley and the resurfacing of the access road to both sides of Franck Alley. HOWEVER, The St. Matthews Quiet Zone was lost, though St. Matthews Officials and Councilman Fleming continue to work on their part of the Quiet Zone that was lost. It is estimated that FRA requirements there could take at least a year to implement. What you need to know, then, is that the train horns beginning at the Chenoweth crossing and four other crossings in St. Matthews will continue to blow until improvements are put in place. Please consider this update as a notice that residents of Reservoir Park and Masonic Home will likely get some of the residual horn sound. I have committed to Councilman Fleming any help that my office may provide toward getting this done as soon as possible.

It was fitting that we celebrated the 4th of July by giving Gene Heustis a plaque, and it's not just because he always wears that fantastic Uncle Sam suit.

Gene knows something about fireworks.

He was strolling along a catwalk on an aircraft carrier near Formosa toward the end of World War II, when he spotted a Japanese plane coming in low, with a lot of bombs hanging from it. He was just a farm boy from New Albany, but he thought he knew a Kamikaze when he saw one.

He had to think fast. He jerked the handle on a door in a steel bulkhead nearby and was about to jump inside when he noticed there were a lot of bombs in there, too.

He slammed the door shut and flattened himself on the catwalk just before the fireworks went off. The blast almost sank the carrier, but, lucky for us, it didn't get Gene.

He also knows something about parades. They got his carrier patched up and back into the war zone in time to be in Tokyo Bay for the Japanese surrender in September 1945, along with 245 other allied ships, and 1,000 planes. Now that's a parade.

Gene came back to the farm and eventually made his way across the river to start a career in service stations on Frankfort Avenue, first at S. Peterson Ave., where the funeral home is now, then to Cannons Lane, and finally he settled at Frankfort and Weisser. Along the way he built up a legion of customers and friends, so that many Crescent Hill adults knew Gene as a friend of their parents.

That sort of engagement will get you sucked into all kinds of neighborhood affairs. Gene helped put together the Crescent Hill Community Council and served on its board, and helped form the Peterson-Dumesnil House Foundation, and served on its board. He helped get the Crescent Hill Old Fashioned Fourth of July Celebration off the ground and has helped keep it going.

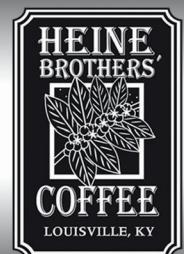

He is a founding father of the Frankfort Avenue Business Association. He helped get the Crescent Hill Newsletter going by driving up and down Frankfort Avenue getting his fellow merchants to buy ads.

One day he was driving with his wife on St. Joe road above New Albany when he came across a spandex-clad person lying bleeding beside the road. It was I. I'd had a bike wreck, and I had broken bones and was missing some skin. I didn't know Gene and he didn't know me, but we soon figured out that he owned a service station almost directly across Frankfort Avenue from my house. He took me to the hospital and dropped my bike off at the house, and that's how he got himself a genuine Courier-Journal reporter for the Crescent Hill Newsletter.

Gene has managed to unload some of his jobs in recent years, but he still delivers meals on wheels every week. This was his last year to run the old car parade, an event that grew out of his tinkering with aged vehicles at various service stations and eventually has involved his whole family. Jason Seiber, a younger car nut, will take over.

So we gave Gene a plaque, and Mayor Jerry Abramson gave him a citizenship award. Some people are residents of a community, the mayor said, and some are citizens. Gene Heustis is a citizen.
