The City of Roswell is using a new emergency notification system called Nixle. Residents signing up for this **FREE** service can receive instant alerts by email, text messages, or both from

- Roswell 911 Center
- Traffic
- Weather (flood warnings, snow, tornados etc.)
- Department of Transportation (road work/closing, recently gas main break)
- Fire Department (trees down, power lines down, fires)
- Police Department (local missing people, criminal descriptions)
- Community Relations (community events)
- National Center for Missing and Exploited Children

This is a VERY valuable tool to have to stay safe and even save time! It does not bombard your phone or email because you can put in addresses that are important to you (home, work, daycare, school etc) and it only sends alerts involving the areas you are interested in. Of course, if you want to know everything going on you can choose that setting also. Help spread the word so we can work towards a better Roswell!
