- 16 neighborhoods will be in the Snow Ordinance streets program. Des Moines has always allowed parking during snow removal, but other cities did not. There will be signs put up at the entrances to the neighborhood and sprinkled throughout to let you know you need to get off the street if it is snowing. They will wait until the snow ends to come by, but we will be first after the snow routes.
- The new wing plows they bought cannot make it down a street with cars (10 foot blade and 8 foot wing plow.) With this program, plow time will be decreased by 33% because they can do the street in 2 passes. They will also plow after only 1 inch of snow. This means the snow will not build up from multiple snowfalls. This will leave a smaller drift to get through at the end of your street after the plow goes by. Even if there is a small amount of snow or ice left on the street, a sunny day will melt them quickly.
- This will help get rid of the ripples in the street because they won't need to go around cars and come back to rework the street after the car moves. It will be more cost effective now.
- Tickets will be issued quickly. There is a police presence in the office to help with this. The snowplows do call in the cars.
- They have a handout that we can put on cars to help warn them they will be ticketed. It has a contact in our neighborhood to help encourage calls and questions. (Carol Stewart said she would be the contact.) They have a website to check. You can also get an email notification.
- A question was raised about having repeat offenders or too many offenses in the neighborhood. They will do everything they can to make this work for us. It was not a problem in the pilot neighborhoods last year. If it was huge problem, they might have to do something about it, but he is so optimistic that he doesn't think it will be a problem.
- Another question about how they determine snow routes. They get suggestions for and against each year and make changes they think are appropriate. Gary Fox 283-4972 with Traffic and Transportation can help answer questions.
- Our plow drivers are entered in a state competition and bring home 1st, 2nd and 3rd place all the time.

There are double pane windows and the hole must be through both panes before anything can be done about them. He will look into declaring it a public nuisance with the broken windows.
- We asked if he could look into who owns it now. The owner and bank listed on Polk County
 assessor site are not correct. He will see if he has some contacts to find out. Someone could be
 paying taxes and getting ownership that way. If someone buys it and moves in, it will be owner
 occupied and they don't have to do anything to bring it up to code. We can start a campaign to get
 the owner to upgrade the property.
