

We pray that Your Holy Spirit would guide our thoughts and actions, that we might strive to live more acceptable and exemplary lives.



February brings our popular Italian Night on the 12th. Limited tickets will go on sale soon, please watch for announcement.




FOUR SIDED HOUSE INSPECTION:


