his has been an especially busy and hectic time for your Board, as we are getting ready to review and act on many items and projects that have been in the works for awhile. I'll highlight the major ones for now and hope you'll agree your Directors all have their plates full with important work for our community. Probably the one of most interest and concern is the search and selection of a new manager. On this topic I have



to personally thank Treasurer MacDonald for spearheading the search efforts. He conducted lengthy and thorough phone interviews with over fifty-one candidates, worked with the CAM Association staff to finalize and vet our final candidates, and prepared all the necessary background and professional paperwork needed to conduct our interviews. I am confident we will be welcoming a qualified and highly motivated individual to lead our community.

While thanks are being handed out, I want to thank Director Terry Campbell and his Security Committee for their due diligence in following up this past month on several security issues - the most prevalent one being dogs, dogs and more dogs! They were able to take a little break from the security cameras and ADT/KNOLOGY issues, as Director Mark Nixon volunteered to tackle the complex problems and stick it out until it is completed satisfactorily. Editorial - Volunteers

very year many social functions and events are planned by volunteers in the community, under the auspices of the ACA. Just look inside the front cover of the Forecaster and you will get an idea of how many activities there are, and a listing of the residents in charge.



But like an iceberg, with 9/10ths of it submerged, many more pitch in and help that are many times unnamed, and sometimes unknown.
