





to TBOS membership to visitors who have never been to our meetings or read our newsletter. Invite them to our meeting or to get a 15 month membership for the price of 12 months. (People who join at the show get in free.)

<u>Food Concession:</u> Quench someone's thirst with a soda or water or satisfy their hunger with popcorn. This spot will involve some standing.

Parking: Be the first to greet those eager visitors to the show and help them into a free parking spot. This is a very important job to keep cars organized and get the best use of the parking area.

Entries, registration and place-

ment: This is a job for Thursday, March 6 from 10 to 4 and/or Friday March 7, from 10 to 2PM. If you are familiar with plant names and good with a computer, this may be a place for you. Placement involves organizing those plants that will go on individual tables rather than in the displays.

Hospitality: Sign up to bring your favorite dish for Friday, Saturday and/or Sunday for the show workers (you) and vendors to have lunch. You have all been great in the past about making sure everyone has enough to eat! Contact Gary at (813)240-8864.

Set Up and Tear Down: Every show requires preparation not only with all of the ground work to be done but also on site. On March 5th and 6th, we'll need to help tape down plastic on the carpet where displays and vendor booths will go plus put up the final set up for the sales tables, food areas, entered plant tables, stage, etc. On Sunday March 9 at 4:00, we'll need to clear out and clean up so that's a great way to help too.

Orchid Doctor: Answer questions from the public about their orchids or about TBOS. Give a talk on something you love about orchids

To help schedule your time, you might think about the areas you can work the following shifts.

Friday, March 7, : 19:30-1:00, 12:30-3:30, 3:00-5:30,

Saturday, March 8: 8:30-12:00, 11:30-2:30, 2:00-5:00

Sunday, March 9: 9:30-1:00, 12:30-4:00.

`Prior to the show, you can pass out flyers to your neighbors or post them at the stores you frequent. You'll be doing a favor because they

will thank you for letting them know about such a fun show!

TWO: Enter your Orchids

If you love your orchids, let everyone enjoy them too by bringing them to be entered in the show either Thursday, March 6 between 10:00 AM and 4:00 PM or Friday March 7, between 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM.

What does that mean? Well, it means that you will need to fill out an entry form showing your name, address and phone number plus

the name of each orchid you enter. If you know the cross of the orchid, that will save time for the people who are doing entries and classification. Also, note the color of the orchid and the size espe-



cially if it is in the Cattleya alliance. If it is blooming for the first time, please note that too.

Your orchid should be groomed. That means simply wipe off the leaves and

check the plant overall for any pests, dirt, etc that may make it not look as good as it could. Clean the pot or slip the pot into a 2nd pot. There are no restrictions on the container as there are with some plants. If you want, you can also stake the spike or blooms so that they show themselves to the most beautiful advantage.

Attached is the entry sheet for the show. Have it ready with your orchid when you bring it in.

By entering your orchids, you can win a ribbon for 1st, 2nd or 3rd place or one of the 22 crystal trophies being presented. Your orchid may also win an AOS award; you just never know.

If that's not enough, it's really fun to have

A volunteer was called for but no one volunteered.

Tom announced that it was time for the Florida State Fair, with setup dates for plant exhibits being unlear but sometime during the week of Feb. 4, 2008.

Patty Cartwright volunteered to head up the committee to put inTBOS'display. The theme this year is "It's Show Time, Baby."

NEW BUSINESS

Jo Anne Hartzler talked about TBOS's upcoming Spring Show and Sale on March 7-9, 2008. Setup will be on Thursday, March 6th. TBOS members will meet at 3:30 p.m. Wed., Feb. 13, 2008 at the Bayanihan Cultural Arts and Activities Center so that members can view the facility and finalize plans. All members were encouraged

to attend this site visit as well as volunteer to work on the many things that need to be —done for the show. Much assistance is needed with publicity, advertisement, and setup. Food will be needed for vendors, judges, and members. Food will be available for guests. The need to finalize the list of trophy donors was presented, with Dory Gallagher stating that she is still in need of trophy sponsors for the Show. She would appreciate payment from members who are sponsoring trophies so that the trophies can be ordered.

Carol Wolfe reported the need for TBOS to purchase a .PDF subscription for the conversion of the monthly newsletter. The cost for the subscription is between \$100 and \$125 per year. Ginny McKinney moved and Gary Krotz seconded the motion that TBOS make the purchase. This program is necessary to convert the newsletter into a compressed form that members can receive by email; otherwise the file would be too large for most mailboxes. JANUARY'S MEMBERS CHOICE ORCHID GROWN BY ED HEALEY: LC Betty Ford 'York'



TBOS Minutes January 17, 2008 Recorded by Gerri Almand, Secretary

Tom Wolfe, President, called the meeting to order at 7:40 p.m. The minutes from the November 15, 2007 meeting were accepted as published in the December 2007 Newsletter, with Charlie O'Chipa moving Jim Van Koolbergen seconding the motion.

<u>Membership</u>: Forty-six members and five guests signed in. Two of the guests were welcomed as new members.

<u>Treasurer:</u> Tom Smith reported that TBOS's net profit for the month of December was \$2279.32. The current checking account balance is \$8959.90.

Education: Joan McLain introduced Marilyn O'Chipa, who presented an educational program on Phalaenopsis orchids. She recalled that her collection started with one Phal. and grew to over 500 in a 15-year period. When the O'Chipas moved from South Florida to Land O' Lakes several years ago, she lost most of her collection due to over watering. The O'Chipas had built a shade house with a sprinkler system, and Charlie reportedly loved to water daily. Marilyn noticed that her collection seemed to be gradually disappearing. In time, she and Charlie compromised, with the sprinkler heads shut off on the Phal. side of the shade house. She has about 100-125 plants in her Phalaenopsis collection at this time.

Marilyn grows all of her Phals. in 100% New Zealand sphagnum moss, repotting each plant annually after it blooms, usually in June and July. She uses Styrofoam peanuts at the bottom of each pot, and generally waters about once per week. Marilyn grows her Phals. under a shelter so that she can control the amount of water they receive and also to avoid the collection of water in the crown of the plants, which can be fatal. She never waters after 3 p.m. The O'Chipas are careful to always position their orchids with the tag on the eastern side of the shade house, thus ensuring that the plants are not inadvertently rotated in their orientation to the sun. A change in the orientation of the plant would produce a twisted spike.

Marilyn inserts Bamboo stakes as close to the spike as possible shortly after spikes begin to appear, waiting until the spike is a few inches tall before securing with a dragon clip. She feeds weekly weakly with Dynagrow 7-7-7 cut to ½ to ¼ recommended strength. In September, she applies Epson salts (magnesium sulfate) at the rate of 1 T. per gal. of water for two consecutive weeks. She applies Caside as a fungus preventative. Marilyn's Phals. reliably bloom under low light conditions. The plants she brought in to show were healthy and strong, with 2" spikes visible.

Members asked many questions of Marilyn, with Bill Thoms also offering opinions and advice. Marilyn's presentation was very straightforward, informative, and appeared to be appreciatively and enthusiastically received.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>AOS and Orchid Digest:</u> Tom had free copies of AOS Journals and Digests for interested members. Applications for both were available.

<u>Florida West Coast Orchid Society</u>: Bob McKinney announced that the next program would be on the orchids of Brazil.

<u>TBOS Program:</u> Dory Gallagher announced that the speaker in June would talk about Pathiopedilums. March and April speakers have not yet been confirmed.

Sunshine: No report.

- Distribution & Exchange: Ginny and Bob McKinney brought in the raffle table plants tonight in Corrine Arnold's absence. The plants were from Byrd's Orchids in Lakeland. Plants in February will come from Phelp's Nursery.

<u>Plant Sales:</u> Carolyn Llamas announced that there were many plants for sale that members had brought in. She reminded members to use stickers to identify and price their orchids so that TBOS would know who had brought in the plants to sell.

<u>Hospitality:</u> Gary Krotz thanked members who had bought in food. He reminded folks attending the 19th WOC to make sure to take cameras with wide-angle lenses.

<u>Correspondence:</u> Jim Brunton reported no activity as December had been the Christmas party, with no speakers or guests.

<u>Library:</u> Robin Saunders announced that all the books in the library had been organized and cataloged. She reminded members to vote on their favorite on the Bloom Table.

<u>Newsletter:</u> Carol Wolfe published the newsletter in both December and January. She requested that anyone having had a change in email address please let her know.

<u>Publicity:</u> Ginny McKinney reported on some of the activities underway for TBOS's Spring Show and Sale. Flyers are now available and were distributed to members to post in prominent places. 
