The schedule for watering your lawn with a sprinkler during **Stage Two** restrictions is based on the last number of your street address

If your address ends in 0 or 1, water on Monday.

If your address ends in 2 or 3, water on Tuesday.

If your address ends in 4 or 5, water on Wednesday.

If your address ends in 6 or 7, water on Thursday.

If your address ends in 8 or 9, water on Friday. Landscape watering with an irrigation system, sprinkler or soaker hose is allowed once a week **only** from 3:00 to 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 to 10:00 p.m.

BEE STINGS



The police department believes the new curfew will help cut down on graffiti, as it gives them more power to enforce it. At a seminar held in June, State Representative Trey Martinez Fisher told of his failed attempts to get the

legislature to pass laws that would take the drivers license away from taggers as part of their punishment. At the same seminar, District Six City Councilman, Andrew Solano told of their program of matching taggers with professional artists. The majority of the attendees seemed to think that this legitimizes graffiti.

There hasn't been much graffiti in Valencia lately. We can thank our SAFFE Officer, Kelly Bender for her efforts. She has apprehended one tagger. If you see graffiti, please contact Diane Johnson at 655-2327. She will do her best to get the graffiti removed immediately. We have several volunteers who remove the graffiti from the neighborhood. There is paint and special graffiti removal wipes stored at the clubhouse for our use.

Everyone can help curb graffiti by paying attention to what is happening on your street. Look for unusual activity. Know your neighbors. Officer Bender is eager to do everything that she can to keep Valencia a nice place to live. If you see any suspicious activity, contact Officer Bender at 289-7602.

Question: I've heard of a lot of home remedies for soothing a bee sting. What works best?

Answer: There certainly are a lot of home remedies for soothing a bee sting, as anyone who has been stung at a family picnic can attest.

A few examples include applying to the sting site a wet aspirin tablet, aloe vera, paste made from baking soda or a commercial meat tenderizer or even an onion slice.

These home remedies and others may have some merit, but the simplest and probably the best way to treat a bee sting involves these three steps:

- 1. Remove, the stinger as soon as possible, if one is left behinds. But do so without squeezing the venom sac attached to the end of the stinger, as this can release more venom. You can do this by scraping the stinger out with a straight-edged object such as the edge of a credit card or a long fingernail.
- 2. Wash the sting area with soap and cold water.
- 3. Put a cold pack or a cloth filled with ice on the sting area. This helps to reduce pain and swelling. Topical products containing benzocaine (Americaine, Sting-Kill, Lanacane or others) are also good at relieving pain. For more persistent itching, you may want to consider applying hydrocortisone cream and calamine lotion. If itching is still bothersome after icing the area, an oral antihistamine such as Benadryl, Chlor-Trimeton or Claritin may help. Be aware that older antihistamine drugs such as Benadryl and Chlor-Trimeton often cause drowsiness, and Claritin may cause drowsiness in some people.

EXTREME SWEEP UPDATE FOR VALENCIA, ELDORADO, AND SIERRA NORTH


This update is from Domingo Portillo, Senior Management Analyst, Housing and Neighborhood Services.

There are trash cans being left in the street. He will ask the code officer do a drive through to pick up any obvious code violations. Capistrano Street will be assessed for cracks in the street.
