

The Long Beach Police Department would like to remind all residents to practice appropriate safety measures, including keeping their doors and windows locked at all times. On August 7, 2009, the Long Beach Police Department's Traffic Enforcement Section conducted a DUI Saturation Patrol throughout the City of Long Beach. This saturation patrol operated from 6:00 p.m. Friday night, until 2:00 a.m. Saturday morning. During the eight-hour operation, eight additional police officers patrolled the city looking for impaired drivers where five (5) were arrested for DUI, (6) cars were towed, four (4) were arrested for robbery, one (1) was arrested for possession of narcotics, one (1) was arrested for an outstanding misdemeanor warrant, one (1) gun was recovered and 46 drivers were issued traffic citations.

DUI Saturation Patrols are a vital component in the fight against impaired drivers. Nationally, impaired driving caused by alcohol or drugs causes one death every 30 minutes. Saturation Patrols have been proven to reduce impaired driving-related collisions by removing these drivers from our streets. The average American has a 30% chance of being killed or injured by an impaired driver.

Funding for this program was provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. "When more people drive sober and safely, lives are saved. It's just that simple," said Christopher J. Murphy, Director of the Office of Traffic Safety. He continued ... "This grant will help make Long Beach just that much safer of a place to live and work."

Flea Market Finds

In last months column I wrote about saving money and resources by searching out bargains at yard sales or flea markets. The following are some items you may want to bring with you and how to go about getting what you want at a fair price.

What to Bring

- Tape measure
- Magnifying glass
- Flashlight
- Illustrated guidebooks with manufacturer's marks and prices, such as The Garage Sale & Flea Market Annual
- Lunch and snacks
- Cash (personal checks and credit cards are usually not accepted)

How to Haggle

The question, "Will you take \$X for this?" is acceptable at garage sales, but the amount must be reasonable. In all situations, from flea markets to big-city antiques shows, simply ask the dealer, "Is this your best price?" Neither buyer nor seller should be embarrassed, and 75 percent of the time you can, in fact, get a better buy. "Firm" on the ticket means the dealer must have that amount. Multi-item purchases may bring a better price for the entire lot.

Where to Find Listings for Garage Sales and Swap Meets

Garage Sales: Check for posted notices in your own neighborhood, the newspapers, and don't forget about checking listings on Craigslist.com. Many religious groups and organizations have group sales to raise money, or to donate to organizations for the upcoming holidays.
