Water conservation in your kitchen

There are several ways to save water in your kitchen. A running faucet can waste 2.5 gallons of water each minute. A dishwasher uses 11 gallons of water per use. Each time you wash dishes by hand and rinse them under running water, 35 gallons of water is typically used. Clean vegetables in a pan of water rather than under running tap water. Run only full loads in your dishwasher and scrape your dishes without water before loading the dishwasher instead of running the pre-rinse cycle. Use your food disposal sparingly. This will also keep your plumbing from becoming clogged by foods and greases, which is an added benefit in addition to saving water.

Remember, water is one of our most valuable resources. Saving water is everyone's business.

The bins have been temporarily closed because a large volume of sod was dumped there. The site was intended for grass clippings, yard waste, and organic kitchen waste such as potato peelings, egg shells, etc.

Jonathan Yellenick, the operator of the bins, is attempting to process this large volume of sod and re-open the bins for normal use as quickly as possible. If you have grass clippings and other organic wastes, Jonathon asks you to PLEASE call him BEFORE you dump to make sure he can accommodate your load. - 7. Organize another walking event in the neighborhood.

As you can see this committee is very committed and energetic regarding securing curb-side recycling.
