GIVING

One could certainly extend the list of the forms of suffering that have encountered human sensitivity, compassion, and help, or that have failed to do so. The first and second parts of Christ's words about the Final Judgment unambiguously show how essential it is, for the eternal life of every individual, to "stop", as the Good Samaritan did, at the suffering of one's neighbor, to have "compassion" for that suffering, and to give some help. In the messianic program of Christ, which is at the same time the program of the Kingdom of God, suffering is present in the world in order to release love, in order to give birth to works of love towards neighbor, in order to transform the whole of human civilization into a "civilization of love". In this love the salvific meaning of suffering is completely accomplished and reaches its definitive dimension. Christ's words about the Final Judgment enable us to understand this in all the simplicity and clarity of the Gospel.

At one and the same time Christ has taught man to do good by his suffering and to do good to those who suffer. In this double aspect he has completely revealed the meaning of suffering. 2

These beautiful words of John Paul II help us to understand human suffering on a level that transforms that suffering from an evil to a greater good. We can enter into that suffering and allow it to conform us to Christ so as to make us more compassionate and loving. Like the good Samaritan, we do not need to experience the suffering, except that if we allow ourselves to feel it in our hearts, we cannot help but attempt to alleviate it in the one who is experiencing that suffering. A perfect example of entering into another's suffering so as to bring out transforming love and compassion was the tsunami of December, 2004. What an incredible outpouring of love that disastrous event caused!

Let us allow all forms of suffering to transform our lives so that we may be rich with meaning!


Project Completed in May

Can I Get A Witness?

April 25, 2005

I was fortunate to have the opportunity to travel to Tanzania for 10 days with Fr. John Judie Ministries, Inc. a few weeks ago. My meeting Fr. John and the opportunity to make this trip just fell into place within a period of weeks, as though it were meant to be, as indeed it was. Fr. John, Dr. Margie Sweeney, her daughter Kelly and I left Easter Sunday afternoon to visit several seminaries, parishes, convents, homes, towns and an orphanage in Tanzania.

We flew into Kilimanjaro where we were met by Bro. George, one of Fr. John's adopted sons, and were driven to the town of Arusha, a few hours away. We stayed at a Passionist Seminary hosted by Fr. Aloysius, while Fr. John stayed with Bro. George at the Christian Bros. home.

Morning Mass, in Swahili of course, was two doors down from our rooms at the Passionist Seminary, with magnificent African singing accompanied by a drum, a rhythmic percussion instrument and a small organ.

The next part of our visit was a flight to Dar Es Salaam, followed by a multi-hour drive by SUV to Arusha over roads varying from paved to dirt with large bumps and deep crevices that totally changed my concept of what a "dirt road" can be. We stayed at Kihonda Parish. Fr. Kessi has been there many years and has developed a parish and school that serves the community. He was lovely, as was his new associate, Fr. Teti, a vibrant, radiant priest, so in love with Christ and the Gospel, and such a pleasure to just "hang out" with.

What is Helping Hands Healing Ministries, Inc.?

HHHM was incorporated on December 26, 2002 as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. We strive to provide aid where the effort can yield the most fruit, that is, working with the poorest of the poor. We are currently helping communities in Eastern and Central Africa, and will soon be expanding to other African countries and other continents. We are an all-volunteer organization. There are no paid positions.

Completed projects include:

- Electricity was installed at St. Francis Community School in Itimpi, Zambia. This school serves approximately 900 impoverished children, many of whom are orphans due to one or both parents' death to AIDS. In addition, this allowed extended hours of operation of the school for adult classes being held in collaboration with a neighboring church to help the adults with literacy and job skills.
- Desks were purchased for St. Monica Primary School in Morogoro, Tanzania for the expansion to add fifth and sixth grade classes.
- Education needs, food and antiretroviral medicines were provided for some orphaned students and AIDS patients under the care of the Holy Cross Sisters in Lusaka, Zambia.
- Initiation of a dairy farm at Mgeta Parish in the Uruguru Mountains outside of Morogoro, Tanzania. The farm consists of a fenced enclosure that can house up to 30 cattle. This dairy farm will supply the milk for the needy of this parish of 6,000. These needy include approximately 150 orphans, 250 persons with HIV/AIDS, and 160 destitute elderly that suffer from protein malnutrition. Additionally, the solid waste from the cattle is being used to provide fuel in the form of biogas for this community.


We are excited about how God is using this ministry to bring healing to others.
