Dear Brothers and Sisters,



Since that newsletter, more specifics on this request have been posted on the website. Helping Hands Healing Ministries, Inc. has been blessed to receive such a request to help our brothers and sisters in West Africa thanks to an alert by Kathy Byrne about the work that Sr. Sponsa Beltran is doing in Liberia.

Helping Hands Healing Ministries, Inc. has agreed to sponsor one tenth of the cost of a rehab clinic for Our Lady of Fatima Rehab Center which provides living quarters for some 300 disabled and abandoned children and provides education and meals for some 1,000 children. Sr. Sponsa would like to have an onsite full size clinic which will have rehab rooms for the disabled children. Additionally, the clinic will have a pharmacy, laboratory, and maternity rooms to provide for the medical needs of these children, as well as the inhabitants of the surrounding refugee camps in this war torn country. Your assistance with this request will be a blessing to those in need now and for vears to come!
