### **GIVING**

#### **Multiplication of the Loaves:**

<sup>1</sup>After this, Jesus went across the Sea of Galilee (of Tiberias). <sup>2</sup>A large crowd followed him, because they saw the signs he was performing on the sick. <sup>3</sup>Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples. <sup>4</sup>The Jewish feast of Passover was near. <sup>5</sup>When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" <sup>6</sup>He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do. <sup>7</sup>Philip answered him, "Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little (bit)." <sup>8</sup>One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, <sup>9</sup>"There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" <sup>10</sup>Jesus said, "Have the people recline." Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number. <sup>11</sup>Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. <sup>12</sup>When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." <sup>13</sup>So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat. (*Jn 6:1-13*)

This parable about the multiplication of the loaves is a beautiful reminder of God's love for us, His generosity, and a wonderful example of divine providence.

Divine providence, according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church is part of God's design. "By his providence God protects and governs all things which he has made, "reaching mightily from one end of the earth to the other, and ordering all things well". For "all are open and laid bare to his eyes", even those things which are yet to come into existence through the free action of creatures." (CCC 302b)

We, the creatures, by our free actions (the free will that God gave us) can choose to participate in the divine plan—the plan of perfection that God has for us. Just as Jesus blessed the food and multiplied it to feed the thousands, we are called as His disciples to bless and multiply as well.

It is the vision of *Helping Hands Healing Ministries*, *Inc.*, that as a result of assistance received, individuals and groups are, in turn, better able to also carry out Christ's mission of serving others as well. I call this the loaves and fishes principle! We thank you for your participation in this endeavor to be a blessing to others and to allow God to multiply our efforts!

1) \$25,000 is needed to begin groundbreaking for a full size medical clinic for *Our Lady of Fatima Rehab Center* in Monrovia, Liberia, West Africa. 

1. What would be the best way people can help your organization?

# What does the Quinquennial Congress Banner say to me?

The Quinquennial Congress Banner is ripe with meaning and symbolism for me. As I ponder its simplicity, I see that it is a study in Christianity.

The first thing that I see is hands. The hands are different colors representing diversity, yet they seem to blend together representing unity. These hands are lifting up toward Jesus. They are raised in prayer and praise. These are helping hands, showing us the love and care that our Lord has for us.

The next thing that I see is a tree. This tree represents death and life - death because our Lord was "killed by hanging him on a tree" (Acts 5:30b); life, because, from His death, He rose again to new life. He is calling us to share in His death and resurrection.

I also see a flower. This flower represents the beauty and sweetness of creation. It also represents fertility and fruitfulness. The flower

quickly becomes a womb and the resurrected Jesus rises up from it. He is calling us to new life in Him.

I see flames. These represent baptism, purification, and the Holy Spirit. I see these flames turn into wings and the Holy Spirit pours forth. Come Holy Spirit!

I see a chalice – the cup of salvation. Taste and see how good the Lord is!

I see the crucifix in the center which is the appropriate place to find it because Jesus is at the center of Christianity and the center of our hearts. He is our hope.

In the ribbons, I also see many paths to Christ. These paths represent our spiritual journeys toward the Holy Trinity. These paths also represent our Protestant brothers and sisters coming back into the fold. I see Jesus' prayer for us, ["so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us" (Jn 17:21)] being fulfilled in our midst.

This banner is inspirational and prophetic. It gives us much to contemplate. It brings us joy, hope, and peace as it brings us into an attitude of gratitude for the faith that is a gift from God!


