## **GIVING**

<sup>5</sup>Is this the manner of fasting I wish, of keeping a day of penance: That a man bow his head like a reed, and lie in sackcloth and ashes? Do you call this a fast, a day acceptable to the LORD? <sup>6</sup>This, rather, is the fasting that I wish: releasing those bound unjustly, untying the thongs of the yoke; Setting free the oppressed, breaking every yoke; <sup>7</sup>Sharing your bread with the hungry, sheltering the oppressed and the homeless; Clothing the naked when you see them, and not turning your back on your own. <sup>8</sup>Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your wound shall quickly be healed; Your vindication shall go before you, and the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard. <sup>9</sup>Then you shall call, and the LORD will answer, you shall cry for help, and he will say: Here I am! If you remove from your midst oppression, false accusation and malicious speech; <sup>10</sup>If you bestow your bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; Then light shall rise for you in the darkness, and the gloom shall become for you like midday; <sup>11</sup>Then the LORD will guide you always and give you plenty even on the parched land. He will renew your strength, and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring whose water never fails. (*Is* 58:5-11)

Isaiah's word about the type of fasting we should employ is apropos for this season of Lent in which we are called to fasting, abstinence, and prayer.

It is common to abstain from carnal pleasures during this time of year, imitating our Lord's journey in the desert, yet a more profound way of imitation would be to share our bread with the hungry, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked, and set the oppressed free because in doing this we are showing our love for our brothers and sisters as Jesus commanded us. I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. (Jn 13:34)

As we imitate Jesus, we grow in love of God and holiness. As we wash each other's feet on Holy Thursday, we can contemplate this profound commandment that Jesus gives us to love one another. Just imagine the transformation that would occur in our world if we truly lived out these words of Christ to love one another as He has loved us. And what a transformation would occur in ourselves as well. The words of the psalmist, "A clean heart create for me, God; renew in me a steadfast spirit. (Ps 51:12)" that we pray during Lent would be answered prayers indeed!

May you experience a Lent full of Christ's love in your heart and a transformation that will be a resurrection with Him on Easter morning! Easter Blessings to each and everyone of you!

Let us continue to pray for one another. May God bless you abundantly!


