

Requesting Your Assistance

We are in need of \$7,929 to make repairs to various buildings of **Tawa Primary School** in Tawa, in the diocese of Morogoro in Tanzania, a mountainous community serving 300 indigent children. These buildings are currently unsafe for use and are in desperate need of repair so that these children can continue their educations.

We have already collected \$4,897 toward this goal. Thanks to all who made memorial contributions in the name of *Marjorie Kelly Sweeney*, mother of *Mike Sweeney*, a board member of *HHHM*. Total contributions in her name were \$2,120. This amount was applied to the Tawa Primary School project and we were able to send a partial grant of \$4,000 to them on March 1st so that they may begin this much needed work to these school buildings.

We need an additional \$3,032 so that this project may be completed. Please help us to help these families become self-sufficient through education.

Having lost my Dad in January, 2004 and now my Mom in January, 2007, I am grateful to have such great parents and so many fond memories. Their best gifts to my brothers, sister and I was their love and devotion to each other as well as to us. By their example, they taught us well.

My Dad, Thomas, was a chemical engineer, corporate leader and inventor, was always organized and always had goals. His charming personality, sense of humor and generosity were added bonuses for a guy with his ambition and are what people remember about him the most.

My Mom, Marjorie, was a high school teacher and guidance counselor also paid attention to detail. Her sharp mind and intellect were legendary but she used it to help others, not to laud over others. Besides her intelligence, she was also a very beautiful lady.

My parents complemented each other. I had every chance at success because of their encouragement, support, and excellent examples.

It was their wish to have contributions made to HHHM in lieu of flowers, but I wonder if that they would have known what a simple wish like that could mean to people a half a world away. In remembrance of them, contributions did the better part of establishing a dairy farm in Tanzania meeting the needs of a community of 6,000 malnourished and impoverished persons. Memorial donations made in Mom's name were used to support a grant to repair school buildings for a primary school serving 300 children also in Tanzania.

I just want to say thanks to my Mom and Dad for your great examples to living and also thanks as well to all those who remembered them in this way and for taking time to visit. Your presence, love and generosity were a great comfort and show of support.

Can I Get A Witness?

I have a dream

I have a dream that I can help those less fortunate than myself. It is a big dream but one that has already begun to be realized. You see, this dream that I have had since childhood started taking shape when I went to East Africa in 2001. I went to East Africa to follow a dormant dream that I had in college to help those in poverty in distant lands. Little did I realize how that dream would unfold! I landed in Nairobi, Kenya on 9/11 and had a very blessed trip!

When I returned home from this awesome trip, I had a lot to think about. How were the experiences of my trip to be used so that my childhood and college dreams could become a reality? I prayed long and hard about this. Over the ensuing months the vision of founding a charity organization started to form and *Helping Hands Healing Ministries, Inc.* (*HHHM*) is now in the fifth year of helping the poorest of the poor. In this short period of time, we have raised over \$55,000 and completed more than a dozen projects or services, all of this at a grassroots level! We do not have a marketing budget because we aim to keep costs low so that donated monies go to the intended projects. Your prayers and generosity have made all of this possible!

I have a dream that *HHHM* will complete projects that are low cost and will have a high impact on those that are served. It is my dream that these projects will be self-sustaining and will help peo-

ple become self-sufficient so that they feel empowered to help others as well. An excellent example of this dream is our very first project in 2003! With \$516.68 we were able to provide electrical hookup for *St. Francis Community School* (pictured to the right) in Itimpi, Zambia in Central Africa which serves over 900 students from grade school through high school. This school can now also provide evening classes for adults in the community. It is incredible how such a small amount of money can go such a long way. Thousands have been helped to get an education which is so vital to breaking the cycle of poverty.



Another example of low cost, high impact projects is the dairy farm established at Mgeta Parish in the Uruguru Mountains in Morogoro, Tanzania in East Africa in 2004. This community of 6,000 impoverished persons including those who are malnourished, the elderly, and those with AIDS is receiving nutritional support from 5 cows and one bull purchased with \$4,242. This grant from *HHHM* to this community also provided for enough fencing material to house a total of 30 animals in the future as this farm becomes populated. A side benefit of this farm, is the biogas for heating that will be generated from the manure of these animals making this an environmentally friendly project as well.

The school electrical hookup and dairy farm project are just two examples of how this dream to provide low cost, high impact assistance to the poorest of the poor is becoming a reality!

I have a dream that HHHM will be able to provide for the needs of the impoverished on a shoestring budget. This dream is already being materialized in part by your generous response to this newsletter. Because our printing costs are being taken care of by Publishers Printing Company, we are able to raise funds through this newsletter at a minimal cost. We are also able to raise some funds through online donations at http://hhhm.net which also helps keep costs down. We also have our Trash for Cash Campaign in which HHHM earns money by recycling aluminum cans, used printer cartridges, and old cell phones, so please keep those items coming in! As you spread the word about the work of this ministry to your family, friends, coworkers, and congregations, additional no



cost publicity is provided helping us to be good stewards of the donations received. We thank you for your part in this dream!

I have a dream that others will be as passionate about my dream to help our brothers and sisters in need as I am. To this end, I have been blessed with a board of directors that agrees that this is a 'love of neighbor endeavor' and agree that we are providing direction to this charity on a volunteer basis. We have additionally had other volunteers at various times to assist with administrative duties and community awareness events for **HHHM**.

I have a dream that my family will be able to understand and share my passion with me. My daughter, Kelly has visited Tanzania with me in 2005 and Liberia in 2006. My son, Patrick has visited Liberia with me in 2006. Kelly has experienced Easter and Christmas in Africa and Patrick has experienced Christmas in Africa. Through these trips their lives have been enriched. My husband, Mike has been financially supportive of our trips so he has not been able to travel with us, but I dream that some day he will be able to take time away from his busy work schedule to join me. In the meantime, he shares my passion through my stories and pictures. Pictured at right are



some of the children of *Our Lady of Fatima Rehab Center* in Monrovia, Liberia, West Africa.

I have a dream that *HHHM* will expand beyond the borders of Kenya and Tanzania in East Africa, and Zambia in Central Africa to serve others as well. A leap of faith was all that was needed for this dream. In 2006, that dream became a reality as we raised \$25,000 to build a medical clinic for *Our Lady of Fatima Rehab Center* in Monrovia, Liberia, West Africa. It took us 18 months to raise this money but I am amazed at the size of project that we were able to complete in the fourth year of this ministry! An additional blessing to this leap of faith—I was able to afford to travel to Liberia in Decem-



ber with my two children, Patrick and Kelly, to visit and learn first-hand the needs of the residents of the rehab center. It was a Christmas we will not soon forget! When you say yes, God's providence knows no bounds! In the picture to the left, I am handing a check to Sr. Sponsa as the clinic staff witness this transaction at the site of the new clinic. The foundation was being laid during the week of our visit and plans were to have the clinic completed and ready for use within a few months.

I have a dream that besides the financial assistance that *HHHM* provides, we will also be able to provide spiritual assistance. This dream has been realized in answered prayers and assistance with providing spiritual materials, items for a retreat center, and a healing service in 2005. While *HHHM* is not a religious organization, part of the human condition needs spiritual nurturing and we offer direction in this capacity when it is requested.

I have a dream that all people will have an equal opportunity for education and quality of life consistent with the dignity that is theirs. Toward this end, we have provided electrical hookup for St. Francis Community School in Zambia, tuition for various students in Kenya, Tanzania, and Zambia, school desks for St. Monica School in Tanzania, and we are currently raising funds to repair school buildings for Tawa Primary School in Tanzania. The picture to the right shows one of the buildings for Tawa Primary School that are in desperate need of repair due to unsafe conditions. We are



currently in the discussion stages of forming a scholarship fund within the framework of *HHHM* to meet additional educational needs. For this dream to become a reality, we will need an ongoing funding source.

I have a dream that you will join me in prayer, passion, and provision as we experience God's providence and enter into His promised land!

I already learned that lesson when we took the leap of faith in 2005 to expand beyond the countries that we were then serving. That resulted in the request for \$25,000 to build a medical clinic, a project which seemed daunting at the time because our largest project to date was \$4,242 for a dairy farm in Tanzania in 2004. But God does not call the equipped. He equips the called! So we must trust and forge ahead. We ask for your continued prayers and support of this work.

I hope you enjoyed the article titled "I have a dream ..." on pages 4 through 6. In it I share more about my experiences of God's providence and provision when we say 'yes' to His call. Thank you for answering that call!


