Current Outreach Needs

The following requests were received in June and September.

1. \$6,600 are needed to start a dairy farm in Mgeta, Tanzania to supply milk for the needy of this community of 7,000. In this parish

there are some 150 orphans, 250 persons with HIV/AIDS, and 160 destitute elderly that suffer from protein malnutrition. This dairy farm will consist of 10 cows, one bull, and material needed for fencing and a shed. We were not able to acquire the needed funds by August, so this project is on hold until May, 2004 awaiting funding.

- 2. \$2,230 are needed for various items (mattresses, blankets, deep freezer, television, and video deck) at a retreat center in Chipata, Zambia.
- 3. \$2,387.40 are needed for a one-year supply of medicines to stock the dispensary (clinic) of a seminary in Morogoro, Tanzania.

Projects Completed in September

- 1. \$600 were made available for the second year tuition of a nursing student in Machakos, Kenya.
- 2. \$1,200 were made available for desks for a primary school in Morogoro, Tanzania. St. Monica's School currently has an enrollment of 160 students in grades one through four and will be offering grade five next September thanks to your generous donations! Below is a picture of some of the desks that are being assembled for the school's expansion.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Can you explain what kind of organization this is?

Helping Hands Healing Ministries, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation. All donations, contributions made to this charitable organization are tax deductible.

2. If this organization is faith based, what religion is it?

This organization has no specific religious affiliation. It is faith based in the sense that we follow Christian principles.

3. How do you control how the money is spent?

The Board of Directors makes the decisions on how the money is disbursed based on various factors such as urgency of need, type of need (Does it fit the mission and vision of the organization?), and availability of funds.

4. What part do you (Margie Sweeney) play in this organization?

I am the founding member and president of **Helping Hands Healing Ministries**, **Inc.** Additional board of members include: Sandra Bissmeyer, Therese Brennan, and Michael Sweeney. I started this organization in response to a trip I took to Kenya, Tanzania, and Zambia in September, 2001. The disease, poverty, and devastation that I saw were calling to my heart for relief.

5. Please help me understand how you can direct this project in Kenya when you are here in Louisville. How do you get the money to the right people? Who is your contact and how does your board know that the money is not being squandered by the people there? Do you exchange the money at the bank here and send it to Kenya? Do you have an office set up there? Are Americans running it? Thanks for helping me understand.

You have very good questions! The requests listed here are from personal contacts that I made while in East Africa in 2001, so I know where the money is going. I have many pictures of the plight of these peoples from that visit (poor sanitation, TB, HIV/AIDS, protein malnutrition, parasites, etc.) One additional board member has also been to Zambia in April, 2002 and August, 2003. I also made another trip out to East Africa this September. I keep in communication with various churches and clergy in those countries that I visited (Kenya, Tanzania, and Zambia) on a regular basis. When they request funds, we scrutinize how they will use the money and require proof of how it is being used (receipts, pictures, etc.). We as a board find things manageable because we are careful to only accept requests from persons whom we have gotten to know. We look to assist especially when that assistance leads to improved living conditions and self-sufficiency. Regarding how the money is managed - it depends on the destination. For some, it is most efficient to wire U.S. dollars to a location where they can get the best exchange rate. Each situation is unique. I truly appreciate your interest and concern for how charitable dollars are spent. We feel fortunate that we can help others in need without a burdensome level of overhead.
