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## Board Elections In November

**Volunteers are needed** to become a part of the Four Seasons Neighborhood Association Board. It is a 2-year term and a maximum of two consecutive terms can be served. **Officers needed are Chair and Treasurer.**

Under the safety committee is the Block Watch program. We need someone to volunteer to head this program. The Block Watch program works in conjunction with Metro Government and is in place to keep neighbors informed and safe. Every street needs a captain and an assistant to help with a phone tree.

## Restrictions On Man's Best Friend

Whether on a walk around the neighborhood or even talking to your next door neighbor, it is the responsibility of every pet owner to abide by the Louisville Dog Ordinance laws in order to keep people and our pets safe. Here are a few examples that pertain to our neighborhood.



- Cats and dogs should have their license and rabies tag attached to their collar.
- Dogs or puppies should be confined in a secure enclosure or be under the direct control of their owner.
- Cats or kittens may only roam freely on the property of their owner.
- Invisible fencing is permitted, however, if a dog is found twice in a calendar year outside of the invisible enclosure, the owner will be issued a violation notice and after three times, the owner will no longer be able to use the invisible fence.
- Only three outdoor dogs are permitted on less than half an acre of land.
- It is the responsibility of all pet owners to clean up after their pet and dispose of it in a sanitary manner.
- Contact 911 or call a physician and Metro Animal Services if you are bitten by a dog or cat.
- Call Metro Animal Services at 363-6609 to report cruelty, animal abuse or inhumane treatment.

## Western Salsa

*Make this salsa with all those tomatoes from your garden. Goes great with tortilla chips.*

4 large chopped tomatoes • 3 cloves garlic diced  
2/3 c. diced fresh cilantro • 1/2 large onion chopped  
2 T. fresh lime juice • 1 avocado diced • Salt  
1 jalapeno pepper seeded and chopped finely

Add tomatoes, garlic, cilantro, onion, avocado and lime juice in a bowl. Add the jalapenos in increments and taste test to make sure the salsa is not too hot. Salt to taste.



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
