- Crime statistics for our neighborhood: February=2, March=0
- He will be here for our street clean up. We scheduled for days he can help.
- They have put speed cameras in a vehicle that they can park in a neighborhood. We can request for us. On Timberlane or Williams.
- Prescription Drop-off: April 30th from 10 am – 2 pm at Walgreens in 2 locations:

- 2 Speed cameras on I235 at Euclid and W19th.
 - In place by end of May
 - Signs to warn will be placed 200 feet ahead of them.
- Traffic light cameras:

 - civil ticket \$65. Camera company gets \$27, rest goes to city.
 - Is there state regulations on how long a yellow light can be? There should be, but we are counting it with the white line.

Update - Flood Control Project along Four Mile.

- Because they are changing the levees, the water must go somewhere so the low areas in our neighborhood will be in a flood plane.
- South of Fairgrounds, Maury, Sewage treatment plant, SE 20th, gravel pit, trailer court in Pleasant Hill
- Get flood insurance now before the price changes. One neighbor had spoken with an insurance agent and said we couldn't buy any after April 1st.
- You may want to put a flap valve to prevent a sewer backup. There is a program available now that they will help pay for this. Good through June 1st.
- You may need to put in a sump pump and deal with the tiling around the house.
