

Dear Neighbors:


Tirst I would like to start by thanking our new manager "Loey Antonucci" for her hard work and dedication to our Cove Community.

Several issues have been brought to my attention and I would like to address them. **TRASH**: Please place all trash inside of trash bags making it easier and quicker for the guys and of disposal.

When recycling, you will need to place only <u>CLEAR PLASTICS</u> in the "Clear Bin" and please remember to remove the caps. I'm working on getting another container for the colored glass and it should be here soon.

All newspapers need to be placed in a paper bag and not thrown in loosely.

LAUNDRY ROOMS: When using the dryers, please make a point to clean out the lint trap afterwards. This will help them to run more efficient and help prevent a fire.

GUARDS: We are very fortunate to have a great bunch of ladies watching over our Park. However, the guard's responsibilities are to enhance the safety of Americana Cove by providing access control for resident and guests, not to deliver messages to the office for a service call i.e. calling about water, electric etc. All residents need to contact the office so we can either write up a work order or provide you with a vendor of your choice.




Kitchen Klub News

Worried About Wings?

ast week, I discovered one of my windowsills was littered with insect wings! I called my Exterminator.

The Supervisor who came around to check on my concern has been servicing the park for many years. He had two reports which I think you would find comforting.

1) The wings and brown bodies were those of dry wood termites.

This species live in small colonies, (not necessarily near the dropped wings), and are very slow eaters. They could live there for years with no notable structural damage.

If the facts were known, almost every home in the park, (even the newer ones), have been invaded by this termite species. "You can't keep them out" and even tenting won't assure that they don't come back next year!

"What should I do?" "Nothing, if you at some time find little piles of sawdust, gives us a call and we will inject the colony."

2) The second account was about subterranean termites.

These are the "Bad Guys". They have a voracious appetite and live in very large nests in the hundreds of thousands. They can rapidly destroy a wooden home. Their intrusion is easy to spot.

Real ID Act 2005



re you about to renew your Driver License or ID card? Changes in effect as a result of the Federal Real ID Act may require advance planning.

The Real ID Act was passed by Congress in 2005. Part of the act was to enhance security standards nationwide for the issuance of driver license and ID cards.



A number of changes were implemented with the Department of Highway Safety in January 2010 to comply with these federal requirements.

To renew your license you must provide proof of who you are, your status, your social security number and your residence.

You can do this by providing your certified state birth certificate or US passport, social security card, and 2 bills with your name and address. The difficulties arise when a name is changed because of a marriage. A woman normally changes her name when she gets married. To meet the requirements of the Real ID Act she would need to show her marriage certified that had been issued by the clerk of the court. But, if she has been married 2 or 3 times she has more dots to link up. In this case she would have to show each marriage certificate.. What the state is looking for is a link though each name change to whom you are now.

Canadians are similar; they must show their Canadian birth certificate, or Canadian Passport and their address here in the United States. Their maximum license period is 1 year.
