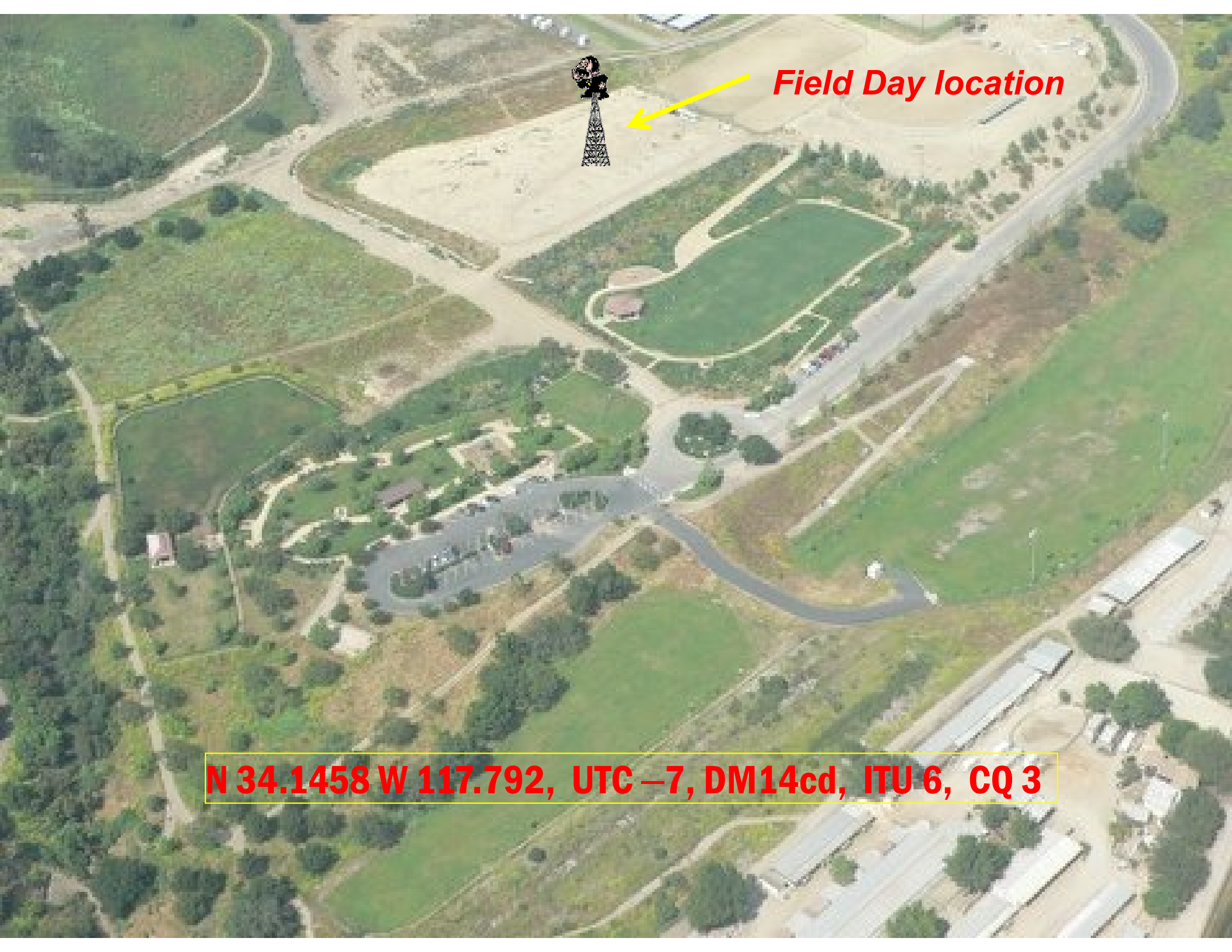

35 foot diameter parachute shelter was set up first

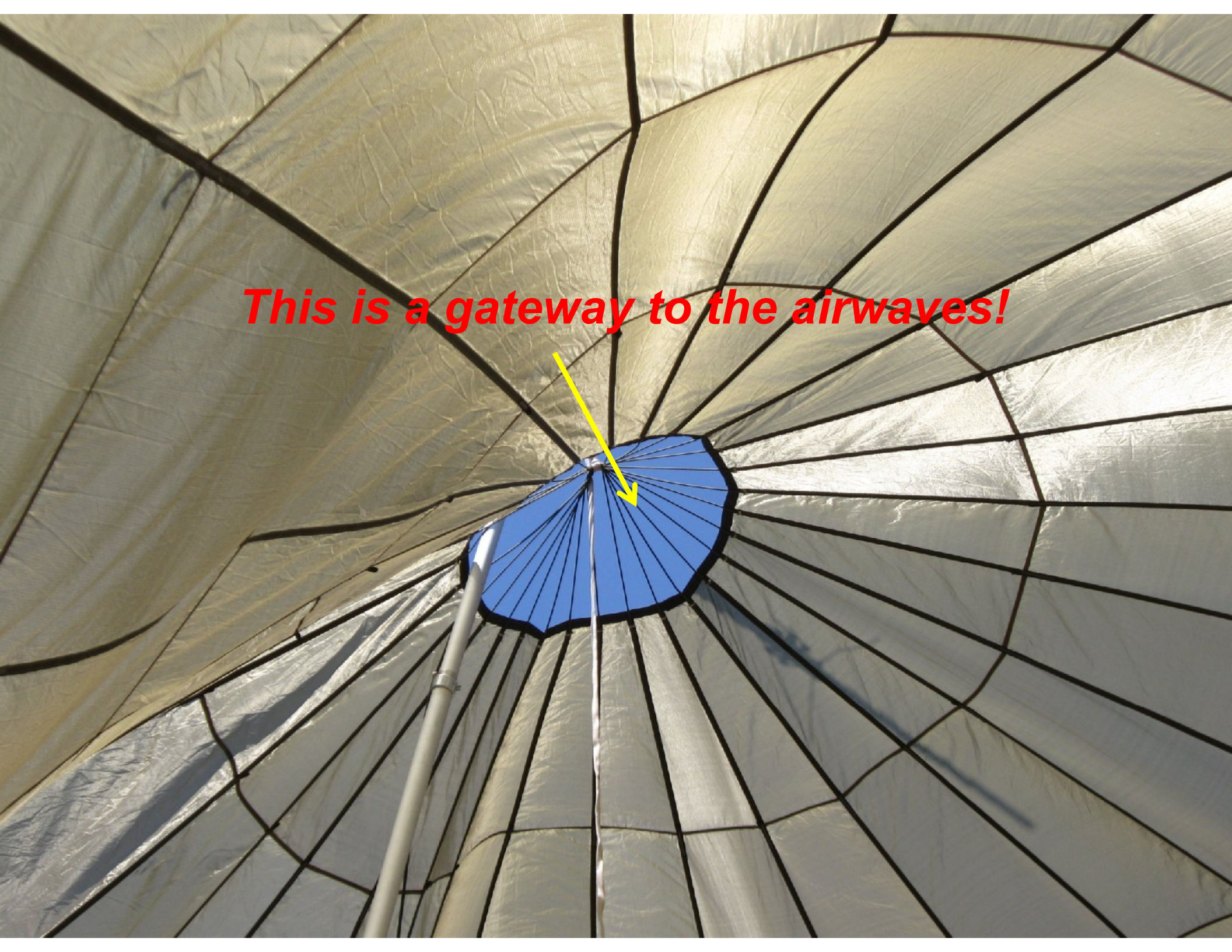


Placing the parachute over the mast



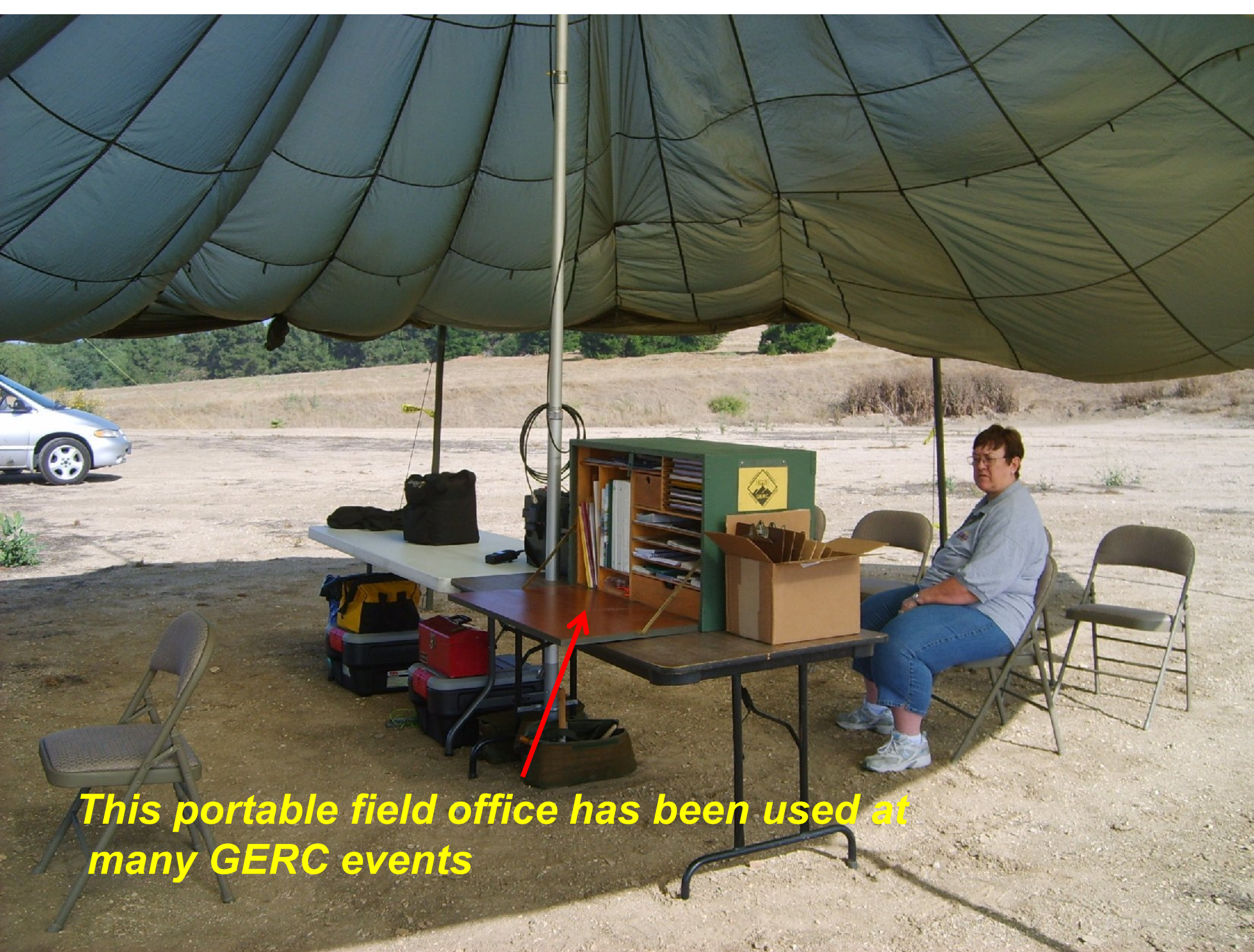
The shelter was raised on a telescoping mast with a dual band antenna on top.

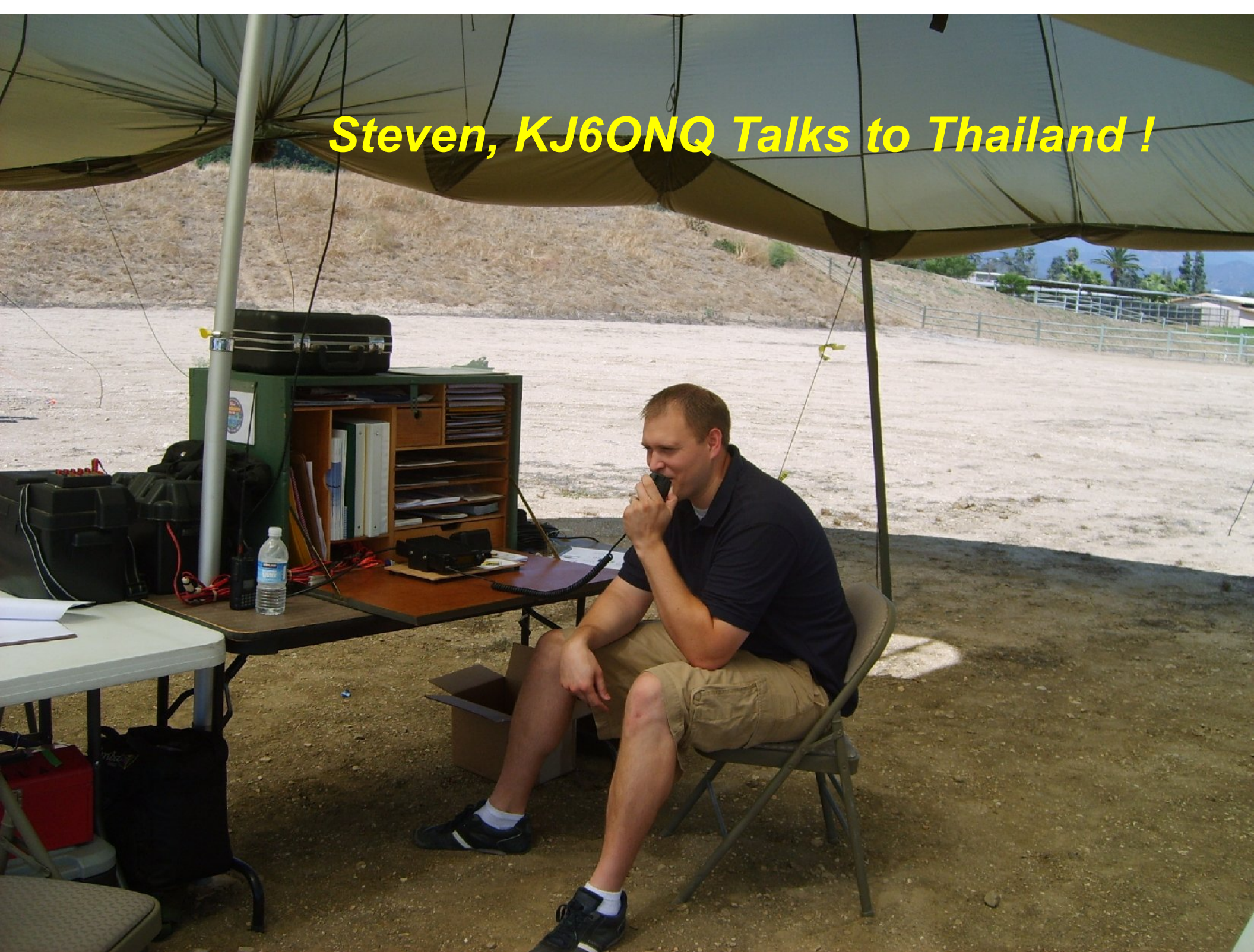

There were 31 participants and visitors making this the largest attendance at a GERC Field Day ever!





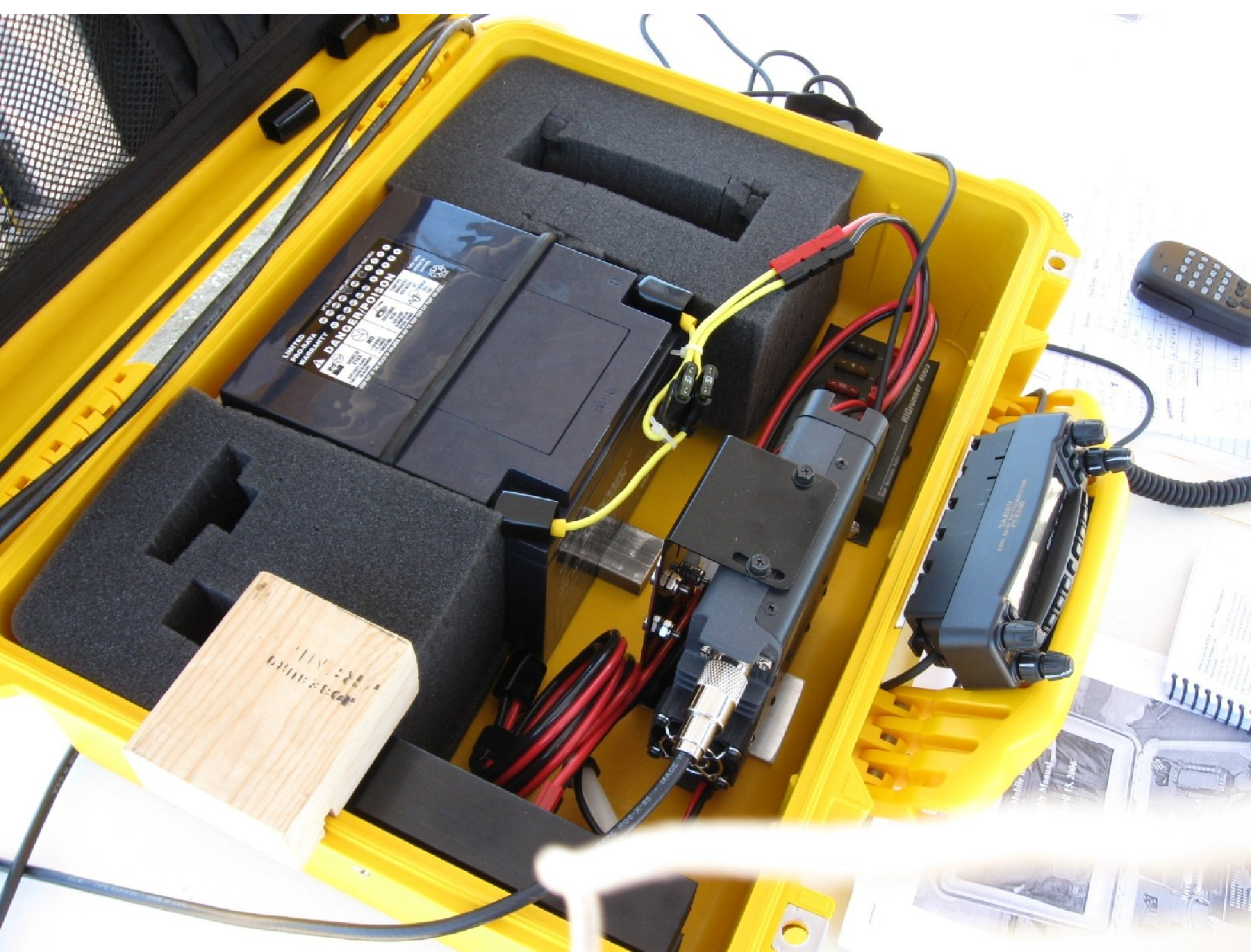

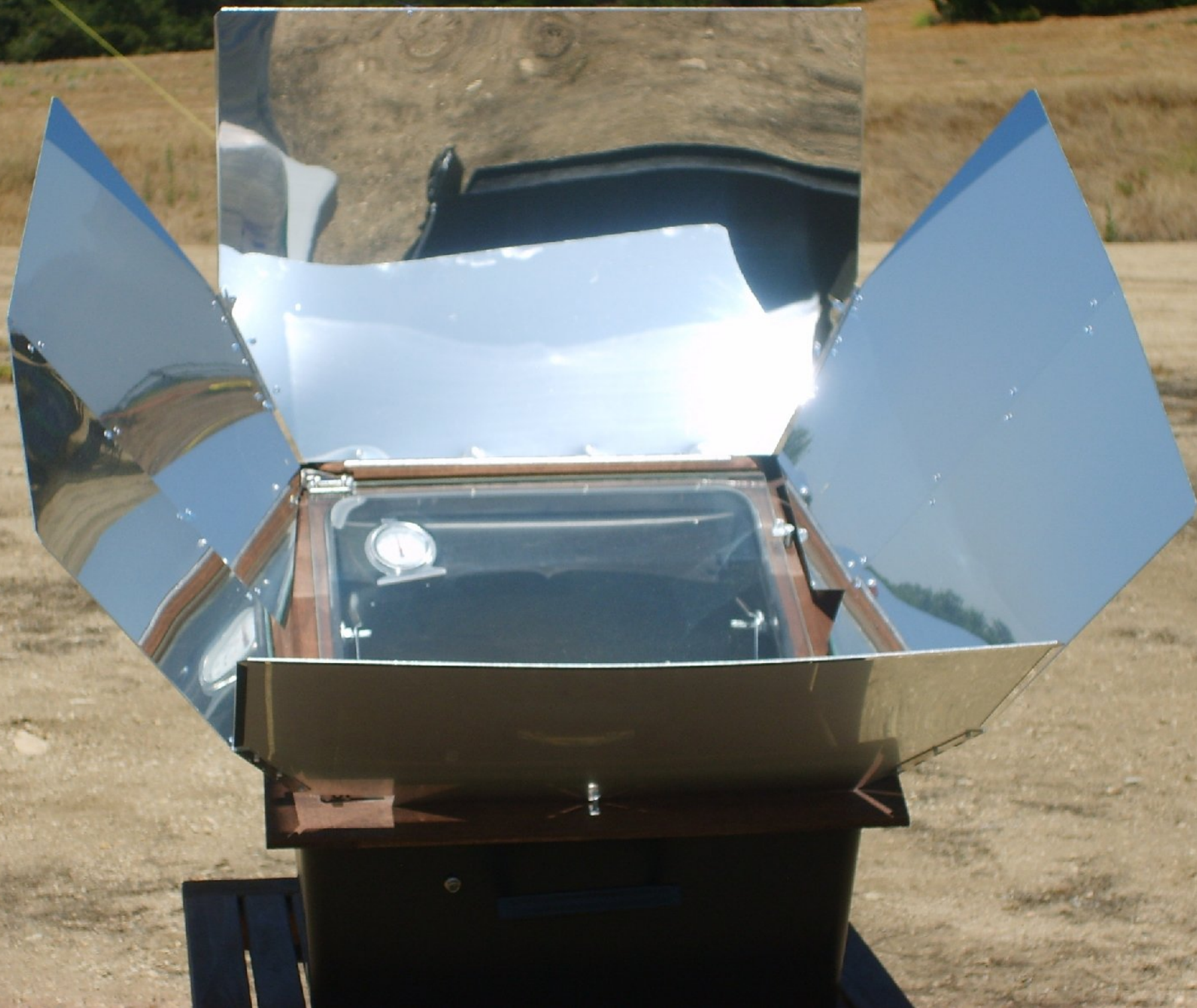
