Tucson and Pima County Ordinances

Trash and recycling

- Weekly trash and recycling collections are on Wednesday.
- Collection containers can be set out beginning at 5 PM the preceding day and stay out until 8 PM on the day of collection.
- During non-collection days please keep right of ways, walkways and sidewalks clear of any trash and recycle containers or other containers.

Noise

- The City Noise ordinance §16-31 prohibits sounds that are clearly audible beyond the property line, and disturb the peace and quiet of a neighborhood or person.
- The City ordinance §11-22 (B)(1) prohibits the use of any fireworks within the city limits.

Unruly Gatherings (The Red Tag ordinance)

- This city ordinance §16-32 prohibits a gathering of five or more people on private property that causes a disturbance of the quiet enjoyment of private or public property.
- Allowing party guests to litter, drink in public or block the street is also forbidden under this ordinance.
- Fines: A minimum \$100 fine and a red tag prominently displayed in a front window for first-time offenders. Repeat offenses escalate in \$500 increments.

- A few tips for hosting parties:
 - The host of the party is responsible to the landlord and to the neighbors for damages incurred by guests.
 - Invite only the number of guests that your home can safely accommodate, not overflow into your neighbors' space or the street.
 - Clean up any litter that is left in public view after the party.

Drinking

The legal drinking age in Arizona is 21.

Dogs and pets

- Dogs must be vaccinated and licensed.
- Dogs must be contained by a fence, and leashed when in public areas.
- Owners must remove and dispose of any solid waste deposited by a dog on public or private property.
- The city noise ordinance applies to dogs and any other pets.

Right of ways, Walkways and Sidewalks

 Right of ways, walkways and sidewalks must be kept clear of any obstructions, such as parked cars, motorcycles, bikes or trash cans.

Parking

 Parking on the right of way, walkways or sidewalks (the strip of land between the property line and the curb) is illegal.

Common courtesies between neighbors

A few good cordial neighborly tips:

- Wave or say hi when you see your neighbors.
- Be careful when parking to prevent damage to any landscaping belonging to your neighbor or in any public area.
- Avoid blocking your neighbor's driveway or mailbox including your own.
- Keep your yard clean and tidy, including the street in front of your home and in the alley behind your home.
- Drug trafficking is not tolerated within the Northwest Neighborhood.
- · Report suspicious activity to the Tucson Police.
