Highlights from 2010-2011

- The Promise Neighborhood Association and 5 work teams formed
- Over 1,000 neighbors participate in at least 1 of 4 community events
- School dances and family movie nights increase at Lincoln Elementary
- 85 children have access to free afterschool sports clinics

- 105 children participate in the first year of the Lincoln community garden
- A Meet and Greet is held with residents and the police force to discuss safety
- 60 children participate in day- and week-long youth enrichment camps
- 55 bags of trash in the neighborhood are collected and disposed of
