She was the first woman ever inducted into the Hall and her accomplishment didn't escape the notice of her sister and brother. Along with Nancy's husband Mark they attended the event in Eagle River, Wisconsin.



"It was a wonderful evening," Nancy said, "We knew that Mary Ann was very involved in Hockey but we had no idea about everything she has done to build the women's program in Wisconsin and across the country." They sat with three young women who went through Mary Ann's Camps and who now all Coach Women's Hockey in Colleges. Richard said, "Nancy and I were worried that all the emotion of the evening would 'get to' Mary but it was the two of us that teared up as she delivered a wonderful acceptance speech that received three standing ovations"

Both siblings were touched by the emotion and love that others expressed for their sister. Her husband Dave and their three children were mentioned frequently for all their support over the years.


