

## Call Before You Dig

What does that color Paint on Your Lawn Mean?

To protect the public water and sewer system, property owners are not allowed to dig in any Utilities Right-of-Way. Before you, start digging along your property borders or **ANYWHERE NEAR** public utilities located on or around your property, dial the Kentucky number **811** or **1-800-752-6007** or visit [www.kentucky811.org](http://www.kentucky811.org) on the web.

Generally, a right-of-way is a piece of property whether publicly or privately owned where any infrastructure has legal access to property.

Any digging outside the right-of-way is the responsibility of the property owner and does not require a call to the Kentucky number or a visit to the Kentucky web site.

Were lines marked in your neighborhood and what do the colors mean?

**RED** ~ Electric Power Lines, Cables, Conduit, and Lighting Cables

**YELLOW** ~ Gas, Oil, Steam, Petroleum, or Gaseous Material

**ORANGE** ~ Communication, Cable TV, Alarm or Signal Lines, Cables, or Conduit

**BLUE** ~ Potable Water

**GREEN** ~ Sewer or Drain Lines

**WHITE** ~ Proposed Excavation

**PINK** ~ Temporary Survey Markings

**PURPLE** ~ Reclaimed Water, Irrigation, or Slurry Lines
