For Those Not On the Amcove Email List:

s many of you are aware, there is an ongoing issue with our pipes. The infrastructure is dated back to the early 60's; and unfortunately when the valves were replaced about three years ago, they were replaced with the wrong valves. Gate valves were used rather than ball valves, which were buried deep in the ground without box casings to protect them from rusting and corroding.

Recently we started on the project of replacing two of the eight valves. This will be an on-going issue until all eight gate valves are replaced. As long as no main pipe issues occur beyond the valve, we will only have an isolated street shut down.










1/2 cup brown sugar, packed


1/4 tsp. salt


